Essential Questions (Bedelia Nicola Richards, 2018)

- 1. Which group or groups feel most at home on the campus and which ones feel like (unwanted) guests?
- 2. Whose norms, values and perspectives does the institution consider to be normal or legitimate? Whose does it silence, marginalize or delegitimize?
- 3. Who inhabits positions of power within the institution?
- 4. Whose experiences, norms, values and perspectives influence an institution's laws, policies and systems of evaluation?
- 5. Whose interests does the institution protect?

Glen Singleton's Courageous Conversations about race guidelines:

- Four agreements:
 - 1) Stay engaged
 - 2) Experience discomfort
 - 3) Speak truth
 - 4) Except & accept non-closure
- Things to guide the conversation:
 - o Focus on personal, local, and immediate
 - Isolate race
 - Normalize social construction and multiple perspectives
 - o Monitor agreements, conditions, and parameters
 - Use a working definition of race
 - Examine the presence and the role of whiteness
