Objective:

- Encourage students to use simple phrases like:
- "I made a drawing."
- "I painted a picture."
- ✓ "I wrote a song."

Example Questions and Answers (A1.1 level)

- 1. Q: What did you make?
 - A: I made a drawing.
- 2. Q: What did you do last weekend?
 - A: I painted a picture.
- 3. Q: Did you make something?
 - A: Yes, I made a card.
- 4. Q: What did you draw?
 - A: I drew a cat.
- 5. Q: Did you use colors?
 - A: Yes, I used blue and red.
- 6. Q: What did you use?
 - A: I used paper and pencils.
- 7. Q: Was it fun?
 - A: Yes, it was fun!
- 8. Q: Who did you make it for?
 - A: I made it for my mom.
- 9. Q: When did you make it?
 - A: Yesterday.
- 10. Q: Do you like drawing?
 - A: Yes, I like it a lot.

Example Q&A Pairs (A1.2 level)

Objective:

Encourage student interaction with simple question-answer exchanges. Focus on follow-up questions to extend the conversation.

- 1. Q: What did you create last week?
 - A: I wrote a short poem.
 - Q: Wow! How did you write it?
 - A: I used new words from class.
- 2. Q: Did you make something cool?
 - A: Yes, I made a paper boat.
 - Q: How long did it take?
 - A: Ten minutes.
- 3. Q: What kind of drawing did you do?
 - A: I drew a house.
 - Q: Did you color it?
 - A: Yes, with markers.
- 4. Q: Did you build anything?
 - A: Yes, I built a LEGO car.
 - Q: Who helped you?
