We will start the new unit on Moon Phases and take a trip outside to measure our shadows.

8th Grade

Mrs. Murphy's ELA Classes

We are finishing our literary analysis of short stories. We will be starting our first independent novel next week. Students will have a choice of novels exploring the theme of celebrating different voices in literature.

Mrs. Singh's Math Classes

We will review all transformations (Translation, Reflection and Rotation) followed by the quiz. Then we start Congruent and Similar Figures.

What's Happening the week of October 3 - 7, 2022

7th Grade

Mrs. Murphy's ELA Classes

We are continuing our study of short stories and reviewing good reading and writing strategies. Students will be reading and analyzing two texts. Their written responses will show their understanding of common themes in the texts and their ability to cite key pieces of evidence as support in their writing.

Mrs. Singh's Math Classes

Common Assessment on circles and composite shapes next week. We will do the review for a couple of days and at the end of the week we will move onto the next unit- Surface Area of Prisms.

Mr. Clifford's Social Studies Classes

We will be reading and seeing different takes on the origin story of Buddhism. By the end of the week students should be able to tell the story themselves and explain the central tenets of Buddhism

Miss Morrell's Science Classes

We will explore the tilt of the Earth and determine why we have seasons, how seasons differ in different parts of the world and the impact of the angle of the sun on temperature and shadows.

8th Grade

Mrs. Murphy's ELA Classes

We will be reading more short works of dystopian fiction in the coming weeks. Students will be writing literary analysis using multiple texts.

Mrs. Singh's Math Classes

We will do Volume of sphere at the beginning of the week, followed by the quiz on Volume of Cylinder, Cone and Sphere. At the end of the week we will start the review for our first Common Assessment.

Mr. Clifford's Social Studies Classes

We will be assessing the big ideas that underpin the Constitution by evaluating the ideas of the founders themselves by reading primary sources from the era.

Miss Morrell's Science classes

Differentiating between chemical and physical properties and changes will keep us busy most of the week, but we will take some time to make elephant toothpaste.

What's Happening the week of September 26 - 30, 2022

7th Grade

Mrs. Murphy's grade seven ELA classes are starting a creative writing unit. We are working on applying what we have learned from reading short stories to help make our stories engaging. We will begin by writing from different perspectives to better understand characterization and point of view. We will have our first vocabulary quiz next Friday.

Mrs. Singh's grade 7 class will continue working on area and perimeter of composite shapes, followed by the quiz. After that we will start preparing for our first Common Assessment.

Miss Morrell's grade 7 Science class will begin working on Seasons. Assessments on Units of Time have been returned and grades will be updated in X2 this weekend.

Mr. Clifford's World History Class will explore the origin and central tenets of Buddhism. We will look to compare it to Hinduism and evaluate how Hindu culture impacted Buddhism.

8th Grade

Mrs. Murphy's ELA classes are starting ME Bag presentations so that we can practice our oral presentation skills as well as learn a little more about each other. Students are studying various genres of short stories focusing on foreshadowing, irony, and building suspense. We will have our first vocabulary quiz next Friday.

Mrs. Singh's classes will start with the volume of cylinder, cone and sphere. We will work on finding the volume using the formulas as well as application of these in real life. At the end of the week, they will have a quiz on this.

Miss Morrell's Science classes will begin working on pH & Exothermic and Endothermic Reactions. Assessments on Lab & Safety Tools and Procedures have been returned (purple will get theirs on Monday) and grades will be updated in X2 this weekend.

Mr. Clifford's Civics class will create brief political biographies of the Founders. By Looking at the political beliefs of the founders we will be introduced to the big ideas that lay behind the Constitution.

What's Happening the week of September 19 - 23, 2022

7th Grade

In Mrs Murphy's grade seven ELA classes we are continuing to study short stories and analyze how an author uses certain literary elements to create mood, develop characters and convey a theme. We are also beginning to complete our minutes for membean (online vocabulary program).

In Mr. Cliffords's 7th grade World History and Geography class we will be learning about the origins and central tenets of Hinduism. We will be using both the textbook and primary sources to develop our historical understanding of the topic.

In Mrs. Singh's 7th grade class, we will be working on identifying the shapes that make up the composite shapes and find the Perimeter and Area of composite shapes.

On Monday the 19th, Miss Morrell's seventh grade classes will be taking a quiz on units of time and building a model of the Earth, Moon, and Sun to demonstrate rotation and revolution.

8th Grade

In Mrs. Murphy's grade eight classes, students are finishing their reflections on our names and the importance of our names to our identity. We are starting our study of short stories. We will be reading a mix of classic and modern stories and analyzing the author's craft/style to help us write our own creative stories later in the month. We are also beginning to complete our minutes for membean (online vocabulary program).

In Mr. Cliffords's 8th grade Civics class students will be reading from the Federalist papers to deepen their understanding of Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution. By engaging in sources directly from the founders students will get a first hand account of the thought process used to create our government.

In Mrs. Singh's 8th grade class, we will continue with equations with variables on both sides and then move on to rewriting equations and formulas.

In Miss Morrell's eighth grade classes there will be an assessment on lab safety on Tuesday. Later in the week students will complete a lab on evidence of chemical reactions.
