VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS

Thank you for your interest in supporting our students! We have designed a volunteer and visitor process that ensures our students' safety and helps you engage with our schools. Below you'll find types of volunteers and the steps to take to volunteer with our schools.

Volunteer & Visitor Levels

- 1. VISITOR: You were invited to the school to visit for a meeting, open house, or to give a lecture or presentation to a group of students, but you will not work directly with students.
- 2. SUPERVISED VOLUNTEER: You will work directly with students always under the supervision of an ACSD staff member. (Examples: a college recess buddy, library reading helper, or someone who comes in to help in a class for a special event.)
- 3. UNSUPERVISED VOLUNTEER: You will work directly with students, but may not always be under the supervision of an ACSD staff member. (Examples: a field trip chaperone or a classroom volunteer who may be left unsupervised.)

Process & Background Checks

VISITOR	 If the principal has invited or approved your visit, simply sign in at the school when you arrive.

UNSUPERVISED VOLUNTEER Although fingerprinting results may take a few weeks, you may begin volunteering with a clear criminal records check	 Complete the Volunteer Application Contact the administrative assistant at the school(s) where you will volunteer to complete this necessary paperwork: Request for Criminal Record Check (Bring a valid ID that confirms your date of birth and signature.) Schedule an appointment with the Addison County Sheriff's office: 802-388-2981 (Bring the Fingerprint Authorization Certificate, your driver's license, and a check for \$35)
VOLUNTEER DRIVER	Complete the requirements of the Unsupervised Volunteer above plus the Volunteer Driver Checklist. See the FAQ below for more.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I have to get a background check each year that I volunteer?

A: To keep students safe, volunteer names are checked *each year* with the Vermont Criminal Information Center (VCIC) and the Agency of Human Services. All unsupervised volunteers must have an initial FBI fingerprint supported background check before volunteering begins. You do not need to be fingerprinted again unless there is a break in service to the schools.

Q: Can I be reimbursed for the \$35 fingerprinting fee?

A: Yes, ask for proof of payment and bring a receipt to the school where you will volunteer to seek reimbursement.

Q Can I transport students?

A: Volunteers who transport students in a personal vehicle must complete the <u>Volunteer Driver Checklist</u> and return it to the administrative assistant at each volunteer location. Please review the Employee/Volunteer Usage of Personal Vehicles for School Activities. No volunteer shall be permitted to transport students if s/he has been convicted within the last ten years of any of the following: *Driving Under the Influence (DUI); Reckless/negligent driving; Driving while license has been suspended or revoked; Hit and run driving; Driving to endanger.*

Qls there anything else I should know?

A: Yes! We are grateful that you want to volunteer and we take student safety seriously. Volunteers are expected to abide by all applicable <u>policies and procedures</u>, federal and state laws, regulations, and other administrative rules while providing service within the schools. The Superintendent has discretion to accept, deny, limit, or terminate an individual's ability to volunteer at any time.
