### University of Lynchburg Prerequisite Course Equivalent

The following chart contains courses at University of Lynchburg that can be used to satisfy the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program prerequisites. It is to be used as a guide and is not considered to be comprehensive.

4 credit hours Biology with lab*	BIOL 113, 114
8 credit hours Chemistry with lab*	CHEM 111,112,221, 222
8 credit hours Physics with lab (non-calculus based)	PHYS 141, 142, 161, 162
4 credit hours Human Anatomy with lab^	BIOL 224/L
4 credit hours Human Physiology with lab^	BIOL 225/L
3 credit hours Advanced Biology (Histology, cell biology, microbiology, are examples but many courses may satisfy)	BIOL 220, 323,356,360,424, EXPH 325, 326
<b>Psychology-6 credit hours</b>	PSYC 111, 212, 215, 241, 261, 344
<b>Writing Intensive courses- 9 credit hours</b> (freshman composition and writing intensive courses accepted)	Writing Enriched (WE) courses
<b>Math- 6 credit hours</b>	
Pre-calculus or above- 3 credit hours	MATH 102,103, 104, 211
Statistics- 3 credit hours	MATH 222, PSYC 274, BUAD 241

Any courses/coursework older than 7 years will be reviewed by the DPT Admissions Committee. This is to ensure that students with older coursework still have the knowledge to be successful in the DPT program.

\* = These courses should be equivalent to courses required in the science majors

^= Academic institutions offering Human Anatomy/Physiology combination courses will suffice if both courses of sequence are completed; example: 4 hrs. Human A&P I and 4 hrs. Human A&P II).
