# **Faith Healing Prosecution Act**

Whereas faith healing has been proven to not work;

Whereas children have died due to not receiving proper medical care;

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of the Chesapeake that:

#### Section 1. Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the "Faith Healing Prosecution Act".

#### Section 2.

- Any parent who rejects medical treatment in favor of faith healing, naturopathic, or other non-traditional methods of healing which results in the child's death shall be prosecuted under current Commonwealth laws for involuntary manslaughter.
- 2. Any parent who rejects medical treatment in favor of faith healing, naturopathic, or other non-traditional methods of healing which results in a serious injury to the child as defined in § 18.2-371.1 shall be prosecuted under current Commonwealth laws for child abuse and neglect.
- 3. <u>§ 18.2-371.1.</u> Section C. reading as follows: "Any parent, guardian, or other person having care, custody, or control of a minor child who in good faith is under treatment solely by spiritual means through prayer in accordance with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious denomination shall not, for that reason alone, be considered in violation of this section." Shall be struck entirely.

## Section 3. Severability

1. Should any part of this act be struck down due to constitutionality, all other parts shall remain in place.

### Section 4. Enactment

1. This bill shall be enacted after passage.
