I worked as an R&D Web Engineer at Dassault Systèmes and as a an Information Management Consultant in the bank industry. In September 2010, I joined the Science and Technology Department of the French Embassy in the United Kingdom where I conducted a study for the French Gov on Public Sector Information in the UK. I left my position in september and I am now working on new projects in the field of ICT for Development.

Why I want to join OKFN:

I am convinced the society as a whole needs a better access to information, a better education and better tools to tackle complex challenges and improve our daily life. I assume this is not an easy and one step process, but I want to take part of it.

I have been first interested in the work of the OKFn when I was conducting a study on Public Sector Information in the UK. I like the way you are doing things: less debates and politics and more projects, community events and concrete things. And I really think this is what we need in France.

Bio: I specialize in the political implications of digital technologies, including: net neutrality, open data, digital campaigning, and online communities.

I wrote my master's thesis on net neutrality, it was one of the first academic studies of this topic in France. I also worked on another master's thesis which analysed the political discourse on open data and its promises.

My thesis project "Open data, behind the scences: sociology of production and release of public data" held the social sciences department of Telecom ParisTech will draw sociological conclusions on the actor network of open data cases around the world and the relationship between stakeholders. Eventually, my thesis aims at identifying the best practices of open data use in organizations, institutions, and companies.

Why I want to join OKFN: I have been a defendor of openess throughout my studies, I know want to join this amazing community as it's proving in action how openess can contribute to solve some of the main challenges of our world.

As a merit scholar of the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, I completed my undergraduate degree in Political Science at the Institut d'Études Politiques de Bordeaux, focusing on online social movements. I later on specialized in internet governance and obtained a master's degree in Communication Studies from McGill University.

Why I want to join OKFN: I have a had a long-standing interest in information rights that, over the course of the last year, has steered its way towards open government and open transport data. France has a budding open data community that is, however, relatively self-contained. I would like to help strengthen the French community by actively linking them to the larger community OKFN, facilitating knowledge sharing and collaboratively developing pan-European strategies to advance open data in the EU.

Mes idées / projets pour OKFN France:

- Action-based reflection groups that bring in experts from all over the EU on how to effectively open data in France (ex. I am spearheading one alongside Pieter Colpaert, Chairman of OKFN Belgium, in Paris on the 20th of october on the theme of open transport data and urban mobility. We will have access to unreleased transport data and using the case of the SNCF as our first pilot for the OKFN Open Transport Handbook. The event will take place from inside an internal SNCF hackathon.) Such an activity, I believe, can be replicated on a larger scale in several different domains.

Why I want to join OKFN France:

As a coordinator of the PD wg, I have been part of the activities of the OKF for the past 2 years, and I can see a value in creating a OKFN chapter in France to promote and support the activities of the OKFN at the local level.

My projects for OKFN France:

- (1) Public Domain : organize meetups and events for people interested in promoting and preserving the public domain.
- (2) Open Glam: last year, a series of workshop have been organized together with Wikimedia France in order to identify the problems encountered by GLAM institutions in opening up their data. A document has been drafted to present the results and to suggest some actions that could be undertaken by the Ministry of Culture to facilitate the process. We intend to continue these workshop, taking 4 pilote institutions from France and following them with a small task-force to help them overcome the various problems they may encounter on the way.

I have a background in computer science & management and have worked within the ICT for Development context at the UN and EU, but currently work in the private sector. I am very interested in the potential of the Open Data and Open Knowledge movement (as knowledge is a unique resource that increases when used & shared), and volunteered at the recent OKFest in Helsinki to learn more. I am now looking for how to follow up on this event.

Why I want to join OKFN:

I am based somewhere between Luxembourg and Paris, and thought that France would have the better potential for an interesting Open Knowledge community. I was however disappointed to learn that no OKFN group existed in France yet, and I therefore will support the effort to create one.

What I am interested in?

I am broadly interested in the concept Open Knowledge, but see a particular opportunity in the development (as in developing countries) context where knowledge resources are limited. As part of a ICT for Development NGO I am currently planning activities for a Senegalese national park (Niokolo), and I would like to explore how Open Knowledge concepts can be applied within this context. At the OKFest someone(?) mentioned an activity in which bird movements had been tracked and shared in an open format. Niokolo notably has a unique birdlife and I wonder if a similar citizen science activity on collecting bird movement & habitual data of these birds, and sharing it in an open and nicely visualised format, could spark interest from bird enthusiast and researchers around the world. Obviously this idea needs some work...
