

Dear Seniors and Parents/Guardians,

School starts again on Monday, January 3, 2022!

Anyone with a January 15th deadline, must hand in their [transcript release form](#) to their counselor on January 3 which is the day we return from winter break.

Transcript release forms need to be handed in to your counselor, **at least 10 school days before the application deadline**. Before you hand in the form, please double check with your teachers that their letters of recommendation have been uploaded to Scoir. These forms need to be directly handed to your counselor. Do not email them, leave them on their desk, or their mailboxes. For example, if your school has a February 1st deadline, the transcript release form needs to be handed directly to your counselor no later than January 18th.

Once your transcript and letters of recommendation have been sent, it may take a college up to 2 weeks to update your student portal. If your portal is showing that your supporting documents have not been received, please call the admissions office to inquire about your documents before contacting your counselor to send them again.


