Accessible Reading Materials

How to provide digital accessibility and "read aloud" to all students



Background:

- When text is provided on the computer screen, students can use the computer to hear it read aloud. This makes text more accessible for all students.
- Techsupport has pushed out Read & Write for Google, Texthelp PDF Reader, and Screenshot Reader
 to all elementary students. These are the tools that you and your students will use to hear text on the
 computer/chromebook screen read aloud.
- These features all work on <u>chromebooks</u> or the <u>Chrome browser</u> of a macbook (or PC).
