

Presentation notes: Cryptoparty

(A grassroots international movement to provide spaces for people of all types to get training in digital security)

- Educational! Free!
- People think "I have nothing to hide" even though they do.
 - That's ok!
- There is nothing illegal or subversive about using a tool to protect your privacy online (just as whispering isn't strange either)
- What Information Do We Create
 - o medical info, financial info, political beliefs, sexual identity, nudity
 - (More and less sensitive based on audience)

- Info is used for things like: private companies advertise to your demographic based on personal info
- Who collects information about us?
 - Private companies like Google that exchange services like email and personalized search for
 - The City of Chicago (e.g. Array of Things. Traffic cameras)
 - Free services (e.g. Facebook)
 - Nixon watched certain reporters aides. This happens in our current and past political climates.
- What is a Cryptoparty?
 - A grassroots movement to protect information
 - Used by:
 - activists
 - lawyers
 - journalists

Steps to take to protect your information:

- 1. Identify the information you are trying to protect.
- 2. Identify whom you are trying to protect the information from. (e.g. a rival company, the state, a parent)
- 3. What is the adversary willing to do to find out?
- 4. What happens if they gain the info? (e.g. loss of job, loss of life)

Three (3) easy to use tools:

- 1. https://www.eff.org/https-everywhere
 - a. Makes it easy to use HTTPS in all the places where it is supported, even on websites that do not default to https://www.eff.org/https-everywhere
- Signal Private Messenger, IM Encryption (e.g. <u>Pidgin/Adium</u>), PGP Email Encryption (e.g. <u>Enigmail</u>, <u>Mailvelope</u>)
 - a. End to End Encryption (e2e)
 - b. Both endpoints (you and the person you're talking to) need to be using these.
- 3. https://www.torproject.org
 - a. Browse the web in anonymity
 - b. Works by bouncing your request through other servers before hitting your destination
