15. What's next?

- Rita's Fundraiser 9/10 we do this event twice a year, once at the beginning and once at the end. Rita's gives us 15% of the sales, and we partner with the Freehold Fire Dept to do Touch a Truck and use their fire bay for a tattoo and reading area.
 We'll also have some special guests, Rocky the Tiger, as well as some teachers and BOE members as our celebrity scoopers, mystery readers and tatooers
- Pre-K and Kindergarten Play Date 9/12 this event is held at Lake Topanemus at 5pm and is for families to come and meet other families that are in the same class as their child. Families can plan their own play date and all the kids get to have a good time playing - siblings are invited! And the PTO board members will be there if anyone has any questions
- Hispanic Heritage Month begins 9/15 and runs through October there will be a traditional pineapple dance outside the front of the school during drop off - if there are any other families that want to join the dance please let us know! Between the tiger team and the pto there will be activities to honor the holiday
- Back to School Night 9/16 PTO will have a table set up with flyers of events happening, Route 9 card forms as well as PTO membership forms - anyone that signs up and pays at Back to school night will be entered into our raffle!
- Lego club starts back up in October, more information will be sent home soon for signing up. Lego club is held every month, a different day for each grade level (Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd) and is an after school activity lasting until 5pm. It is \$5 per student and must be sent in to your students teacher after signing up. We can always use volunteers and would love to have your help! If you signup to volunteer, your \$5 fee is waived! This is one of our biggest fundraisers during the year and always has a great turn out. We typically have a theme or specific challenge to work on, and also allow the students to take creative liberties and just have fun
- Pre-K Playdoh Party this activity is a little different from Lego club, it is also an after school activity, one parent/guardian <u>must stay with the student for the entire time</u>, since the students are so young. This activity is also only held 3 times a year October, January and May. Our first one will be on 10/21, and flyers will be sent home soon with your preschooler and is \$5 per student. We will have a theme to go along with the season / holiday we are around

Trunk or Treat 10/24 - this is our most popular event, it is a lot of fun and we take over the entire parking lot. We have cars parked in the pre school parking lot and the teachers lot next to it, to set up your trunk and had out candy. There will be a contest for best trunk. We could use parent volunteers, it does not have to be for the entire event, even 30 minutes is a great help to run this event smoothly! There is a \$10 per family entrance fee at the door! We will also be accepting snack, drink and food donations to sell during the event
