A veteran of World War I, Lee L. Endter, 79, of 742 Jefferson St., died at 1 p.m. Saturday at Mercy Medical Center.

Mr. Endter was born Sept. 27, 1889, in Appleton, and married Veronica Green in 1924, in Freedom. He operated his own sheet metal shop for many years. Mr. Endter was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church. He was a school teacher for several years before going into business.
