

Concept Document and Calendar: The Communist Manifesto Reading Group

Summary: The Communist Manifesto Reading Group is a reading group starting in June 2024, with the purpose of reading and discussing one of the key works in the radical tradition: *The Manifesto of the Communist Party*, written by Karl Marx and Frederick Engels. Based in the DC area, the Reading Group hopes to analyze its history, legacy, and the world that created it since it was released just before the Revolutions of 1848 with the help of China Mieville's recent book *A Spectre, Haunting*. The group will meet weekly in a virtual setting on Tuesday nights, with 2 in-person social events around the DMV and the option to continue future socials or continue readings and discussions. No experience or knowledge level is required to join. *The Communist Manifesto* and the essays we will read are available for free online.. The group will use a Notes document during and before meetings to gather members' thoughts and questions.

Origin: The idea for the group came from two sources: 1) New members joining DSA without having read many socialist classics 2) The relevance of the Communist Manifesto in an era where the socialist movement is found more in groups such as the Communist League and DSA than with state power or mass membership organizations. The group intends to meet interest in the history of socialism by reading a key work on the topic.

Details: The group is based with Metro DC DSA's Political Education Workgroup and welcomes members from outside of the organization. The group will primarily consist of reading and then holding online meetings to discuss the Communist Manifesto and its legacy.

Structure: The group will have 2 coordinators that take responsibility for administrative elements of the group. The group will pass facilitation duties and other conversational responsibilities between members meeting-by-meeting unless the group determines otherwise.

Timeline and Location: The group is intended to start readings and discussion just after Memorial Day in 2024. The group will meet ~every week until late July, with meetings held all or mostly online and with 2 dedicated group social meet ups. The reading group may hold some meetings outside of the reading structure if prompted by anyone.
