All students in orchestra need a pencil, music, and their instrument at every rehearsal. **Coming prepared to rehearsal is essential to success in the orchestra program!!** Cellos and basses will use school instruments; violins and violas should try to rent their own instruments but will be provided a school instrument if needed. Rental information is available from Ms Call.

Expectations

Everyone in orchestra (students and teachers) are expected to try their best, take ownership of their own learning, and have a positive attitude.

Concerts

Concerts are a unique and important opportunity to display our learning. Attendance is mandatory at scheduled concerts, and attendance automatically fulfills this grading requirement. Excusable absences for a concert are: death in the family, severe illness with a doctor's note, or other family emergency. **Conflicts with sporting or other extra-curricular organizations are not considered acceptable absences**. A concert make-up will be scheduled within a week of the missed performance for acceptable excuses. In marking periods where there is not a concert, this portion of the student's grade will be based on a performance or project grade. Concert dress is black pants and black top unless otherwise indicated.

Lessons and missed lessons

Students have one lesson every week, usually amounting to eight to nine lessons in one marking period. Their lesson will be on the same day of the week (for example, every Tuesday) and rotate the period (for example, 1st period this week and 2nd period next week). Lesson schedules are posted in the Google Classroom, in the music wing, and on Ms. Call's website. It is the responsibility of the student to be aware of scheduled lessons and make up any missing lessons.

Students will occasionally miss a lesson due to a conflict or forgetfulness. No points are taken if the student notifies Ms. Call in advance of missing a lesson or follows up on the same day. There is a five point penalty for missing a lesson without checking in with your teacher. A missed lesson must be made up within one week of the scheduled date to avoid losing more points. This helps students keep updated on important material on a consistent basis rather than making up several lessons near the end of the quarter. Lessons made up past that time will receive a lower grade. Lesson make ups can be scheduled for the same period on a different day or during study hall with Ms Call.

Learning an instrument can be a challenging process and lesson attendance is essential to making progress. Students who miss five or more lessons in one marking period may be switched from enrollment in Orchestra into Instrumental Lessons until lesson attendance improves.

Portfolio learning

Digital portfolios are used in orchestra to record a student's progress and allow them the opportunity to use their own observations to benefit their learning. The portfolios are connected to the school's email account and are not searchable by public search engines such as Google. There is ample computer access at school if home internet access is unavailable; any student with concerns should see Ms. Call for additional details.

Grading

- 50% Lessons- based on effort, materials, posture, rhythm, and intonation
- 20% Rehearsals- based on effort, participation, and coming prepared to rehearsal
- 20% Assignments- often completed during lessons or rehearsals
- 10% Concerts- based on attendance
