

#### Introduction

This profile explores the demographic, social and economic characteristics of King's Park Ward and is largely based on data drawn from the 2021 Census. The ward profiles should be a helpful resource for local people and services that want a basic overview of the key characteristics and make up of local wards.

All data used in this profile has been drawn from the Office for National Statistics (ONS) 2021 Census unless otherwise stated.

The 2021 Census included questions around sexual orientation and gender identity, however this data is not available at Ward level to protect identities of responders. For information at borough level, please read our briefing on <u>sexual orientation and gender identity</u>.

#### Impact of the Covid-19 Pandemic

The 2021 Census in England and Wales took place on 21st March 2021 when the UK was in lockdown.

The ONS has recognised that the coronavirus pandemic may have affected Census 2021 data in a variety of ways, but has said that for most of the population, the coronavirus pandemic would not have affected where they considered themselves resident. They do however accept that for some students and in some urban areas, there is evidence that the coronavirus pandemic did result in changes to where people lived and that these changes might have been temporary for some and permanent for others.

A significant amount of work was done to encourage as many Hackney residents as possible to complete the census with the ONS reporting 90% percent of forms returned.

- The median age of Hackney is 32, this is lower than both London (35) and England (40)
- Hackney has proportionally more children aged 4 years and under than London or England, around the same proportion of children aged 5 to 15, and fewer young

- people aged 16 to 19. It has a particularly large cohort of 25 to 34 year olds, and fewer people aged 50 to 85 and over.
- Kings Park Ward has a higher proportion of children and young people aged 5 to 19 compared to the borough average. It also has a higher proportion of older residents aged between 50 and 85.

- Hackney is one of the most ethnically diverse boroughs in the country over 40% of its people are non-White.
- Black groups make up the second largest community, accounting for 21.1% of Hackney's people, followed by the White Other group, which can include East and West Europeans, North and South Americans, White Africans and Antipodeans.
- Kings Park Ward has a higher proportion of Black and Mixed/Multiple groups than the borough average as well as a higher proportion of Bangladeshi and Pakistani residents.

- 30.7% of Hackney's residents describe themselves as Christians a significantly lower proportion than in London or England. The borough has relatively high proportions of people of the Jewish faith, Muslims and people with no religion or who declined to state one.
- Kings Park Ward has a higher proportion of people of Christian and Muslim faiths compared to the borough average and a lower proportion of people with no religion.

- Hackney has proportionately more lone parent, single person, cohabiting couples and other household type households than the averages for both London and England, and fewer single family households (both with and without children).
- King's Park Ward has a higher proportion of single family households and lone parent families compared to the borough average.

- Over 40% of Hackney's housing is socially rented, a much higher percentage than in London or nationally. Home ownership is correspondingly lower - just under a quarter of the borough's households are owner occupiers. Nearly a third of Hackney's households rent from a private landlord.
- King's Park Ward has a higher proportion of owned properties and more socially rented properties than the borough average and significantly fewer private rented properties.

- London's qualifications profile tends to differ slightly from the national picture. It has a
  better educated population, with 46.7% of people having at least a first degree (Level
  4 or 5). It also has below average rates of residents with Level 1 or 2 qualifications
  and lower rates of residents with no qualifications too.
- These trends are more pronounced in Hackney with over 50% of residents having degree level qualifications. The proportion with no qualifications in Hackney is slightly higher than the London average, but lower than the England average. Hackney has relatively few adults with mid-level qualifications.
- King's Park Ward has a higher proportion of residents with no qualifications than both the borough, London and national averages. It has a higher proportion of residents with Level 2 and 3 qualifications compared to Hackney overall but a lower proportion of residents with Level 4 qualifications.

- London's profile is skewed towards managerial, professional and administrative occupations with smaller proportions than nationally of skilled trades people, process plant and machine operatives, and those in personal or customer service occupations.
- Hackney differs slightly from the London pattern in having higher percentages of people in professional occupations, associate professional and technical professions.
- King's Park Ward has a lower proportion of residents in managerial and professional occupations than the borough average and higher proportions of residents working in care, sales, process and elementary occupations.
