SWWG Presentation

- Well received, especially by Rep. Aaron, Chair of Env/Ag
- Nick Germana & Terry Sparr want to advance a bill; need a Rep. sponsor
- Rep. Ebel has asked us to pause until after June SWWG meeting where legislation will be discussed
- NH DES interested but concerned about staffing capacity to enforcement (only 1 person for the entire state)
- **ACTION:** Decide where bill should best fit into a statute; also need to consider carbon footprint of paper bags
- **ACTION:** Peter Schmidt will contact ALDI management about their corporate wide no plastic bag policy
- Beyond Plastics will support us, and trust other groups will get on board
- Nora Bosworth (CLF) and will help draft legislation
- Gretchen Salter (Safer States) will help us understand CA bill revisions
 - Will add provision to restrict plastic bags completely
 - Worked directly with Grocer's Association on press conferences/testimony
 - Did not work chain by chain
- Ivana Start (Clean Water Action MN) working on fighting a pre-emptive bill to prevent banning SUP bags; retailers want statewide legislation (same with us re: Hannaford's)
- Waiting to hear from Maine reps on their bill
- Consider paper industry as collaborators (3 paper bag companies in NH)

Notes from Susan Richman:

- The plastic bag subgroup has been communicating with grocery stores and the waste/environment officials of other states, gathering information and hopefully creating relationships.
- Yesterday I spoke with Kevin Daigle, President of NH Grocers Assn, who very clearly stated any bag ban must apply to all retail stores, and have no reporting demands for the stores, and no responsibilities for the state.
- I think the NJ model comes closest (no bags at all, no fee at all; but they do sell the \$1-2 stronger stitched handle bags) but he insisted we should go with the "familiar" models of Maine and Vermont.
- I've learned from my very kind local Hannaford manager that Gov Ayotte wants a sustainability discussion with Hannaford folks, and I believe with other retailers.
- RECEIVED A MESSAGE FROM Hannaford's new Sustainability person, Samantha Pease, and she'll be in touch soon
- O What You Can Do:

- Speak with the retailers you come in contact with; let them know that legislation is being drafted for plastic bag reduction; what do they recommend as a good way to go about this? What would be less helpful?
- Keep the petition going; we've paused at 4450 can we make it to 5000 or 10,000?
- Give presentations (Rotary, Kiwanis, Chamber of Commerce, church groups, knitting clubs, libraries, local environmental/conservation groups); we have ppt you can use or mix & match
- **ACTION:** Consider starting a bag share program with a local retailer, laundry service, co-op. **Models:**

 - Bag Share Project (Massachusetts)

- Fossil Fuel Investments Webinar
 - 99% of Americans are forced to invest in fossil fuels in their retirement plans.
 - o Almost 20% of investments in fossil fuels come from retirement savings.

- If you took 12 companies including Adobe, Amazon, Apple, Google, Intuit, Meta, Microsoft, Netflix, Oracle, etc: the employees have lost \$5.1 billion due to their companies investing in fossil fuels.
- o If you took \$10,000 and invested in fossil fuels 10 years ago, guess how much money you'd have today? \$10,004.
- If you took the \$10,000 and invested in the S&P 500 minus the fossil fuels, you'd have \$34.851!
- Google has invested \$1.7 billion in fossil fuels through their retirement savings. If they hadn't done that it would be like taking 700,000 cars off the road.
- An explanation of why fossil fuel companies are desperate to turn to plastics.
