

Are the Republicans Any Better?

In a word, yes. But first, understand that there are four separate philosophies from the two parties.

The establishment Democrats want to **remake America** so they can never lose an election. The Democrat populists are socialists, communists and Islamic fundamentalist who hate America and want to burn down the entire system. The establishment Republicans want to **manage the decline at a slower speed**. The America First populists — the faction the media insists on pretending is extreme and represents the entire GOP — are the **only people in the building who actually want to fix the machine instead of run it**.

One party is an active threat. The other, at worst, is a passive one. There's a difference between a house on fire and a house that's been left to rot.

The Democrats: Power as an End in Itself

Nothing about the modern left makes sense until you understand one thing: **they are not pursuing a policy agenda. They are pursuing power**. The agenda is downstream. The programs, the language policing, the institutional capture, the lawfare — these are all *means* to the same *end*: control.

This is why their positions shift so conveniently. The same people who spent decades preaching that the media must be independent now demand it be weaponized. The same people who denounced government surveillance now cheer it when the target is a political opponent. The same people who insisted elections must be trusted now insist they must be *certified* — by the right people, under the right rules, with the right outcomes.

When the goal is power, **there is no principle that cannot be sacrificed**. Every value is negotiable; the only non-negotiable is winning. This is what makes them so dangerous. A party that believes in nothing but its own rule will do *anything* — lie, cheat, rig the rules, jail its enemies, rewrite the history, silence the dissenters — because there is no moral floor. There's only the next election, the next appointment, the next lever of the administrative state.

And they have been *spectacularly* successful at it. Not because they're smarter — they aren't — but because **they have no shame, and their opponents have no spine**.

The Establishment Republicans: The Beaten Dog

The establishment Republicans — the donor wing, the consultant class, the country club set, the careerists who have spent thirty years "losing gracefully" — are mostly referred to as RINOs, or "Republicans in Name Only." But most are actually Republicans, just weak Republicans trying to act "reasonable" to please the Democrats and the *New York Times*. They are not evil in the way the left tries to frame them. While some might be in cahoots with the grifting Democrats, most are not evil at all. They are **feckless**.

They campaign on dismantling the machine and then quietly administer it. They run on shrinking the administrative state and then grow it. They thunder against the spending bills and then vote for them the moment "bipartisanship" is required. Their governing record is a tax cut for the donors, a prayer, and a press release.

Why? Because they've **internalized the media's rules**. They watched the press destroy their colleagues over minor gaffes while burying Democrat scandals that would end any Republican career in an afternoon. They watched every conservative get called a racist, a fascist, a Nazi — systematically, for decades. And they learned the wrong lesson.

They learned that fighting back is pointless. That standing on principle gets you destroyed while the other side stands on nothing and gets protected. That the only way to survive is to **stop giving them ammunition** — so they preemptively apologize, water themselves down, and abandon every position that distinguishes them from the people they're supposed to oppose.

This is how you get the McConnell's and the Romney's and the Ryan's — men who don't oppose the leftist agenda so much as **manage its implementation at a slightly slower pace**. They aren't corrupt in the Democrat sense. They're neutered. The watchdog didn't just protect one side; it broke the other side's will to fight.

The result is **controlled opposition** — and the Democrats couldn't be happier. A feigned enemy is more useful than a real one. Every "reasonable" Republican who provides bipartisan cover for the next spending bill, the next weaponization, the next capitulation is a gift. The left doesn't want the RINOs defeated; it wants them *in charge of the opposition, forever*.

The America First Grassroots: The Only Ones Trying

But the RINOs are not the whole story, and pretending they are is its own kind of dishonesty.

There is a faction inside the GOP — the grassroots, the populists, the Trump Republicans, the people who actually believe what the party says out loud — that is **the only faction in American politics with a genuine desire to solve problems**.

This isn't the old conservative-versus-liberal fight. The America First coalition is conservatives, working-class Democrats, independents, and disaffected voters of every stripe, united by exactly one thing: **opposition to the uniparty**. They aren't loyal to a label. They're loyal to an agenda — and they actually want it carried out.

They want the border **secured, not managed**. The administrative state **dismantled, not tamed**. The wars **ended**. The trade deals **rebalanced**. The rot in both parties **torn out by the roots**.

When they're in charge, **things actually move**. And the establishment on both sides fears them for exactly one reason: they're the only people in Washington who would rather *solve* the problem than *keep it as a fundraising issue*.

They detest the RINOs not because the RINOs are insufficiently conservative, but because **the RINOs are part of the machine the populists are trying to tear down**.

And before anyone reaches for the cheap retort — yes, the left has "populists" too. They're called *communists*. They don't want to fix the country; they want to own it. Their program isn't reform, it's replacement. The conservative populist tears down the bureaucracy so the people can govern themselves. The left populist tears down the country so the vanguard can rule. **One is a cure. The other is the disease with a friendlier slogan.**

So, are the Republicans any better?

Here's the distinction that matters, and it's the one the left works hardest to blur:

The other party, in its establishment form, **doesn't cause a lot of damage, but does nothing to undo it**. That's not a defense of the RINOs. It's an indictment. Doing nothing while the other side burns the house down is not a governing philosophy; it's dereliction.

But it is *different* from arson.

The honest answer to "are the Republicans any better?" is: **it depends on which Republicans you mean**.

The **establishment Republicans** are better only in the narrowest sense — they aren't actively trying to destroy the country. The **America First populists** are better in the only way that matters: they're the only faction that treats the country's problems as *problems to be solved* rather than *issues to be fundraised*. They'd rather fix the machine than run it — and that's precisely why both establishments, left and right, fear them.

So don't ask whether the Republicans are better than the Democrats. Ask a sharper question: **who is trying to put out the fire, who is filing the paperwork, and who is holding the matches?**
