#### Tuesday, August 15- First Day of School

Hooray! We can't wait to see all of our new Vikings!

Morning carpool starts at 7:30am. We recommend you arrive early and be patient as we work to get students safely where they need to be. It usually takes a good week to run smoothly. We always have plenty of faculty and staff outside and inside the buildings to help our new students find their way around on the first day of school.

The first day of school is an early dismissal day. School runs from 7:50am-12:30pm. Please keep in mind that Preschool-5th grade after-school care WILL NOT be available on this particular 12:30 dismissal day. Also, the cafeteria will be closed so students will need to bring a lunch and drink from home.

#### Thursday, August 25- 1st-8th Parent Orientation with Teachers

- Grades 1-6 can come at either 6:00, 6:20, or 6:40. Each session is 20 minutes. Location: your child's homeroom.
- Grades 7-8 must come at 7:00. Jr. High session is 45 minutes. Location: cafeteria

There will be multiple sessions in case you have more than one student. Learn more about your child's grade-specific curriculum, expectations, and what the year will look like. This is a parents only meeting.

# **General Information**

#### **School Hours:**

Morning carpool starts at 7:30am. School runs from 7:50am-2:45pm. If you arrive at school after 7:50am, you will need to drive around to the school office entrance. Tardy students will enter the school through the office. Afternoon carpool tends to have 2-3 waves of cars, but kids should be picked up by 3:00pm. If you arrive after 3:00pm, your child will be in the school office. Our school office hours are 7:30am-3:30pm.

#### 12:30 PM Half Day Fridays

Most of the Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese have early dismissal days scheduled for a variety of reasons such as special staff training, teacher professional development classes, or the start of a holiday or extended break. You can find these dates on the school calendar. On 12:30 early dismissal dates, the cafeteria will always be CLOSED. Students will need to bring a lunch and a drink from home that day. Buses will always run. After-school care staff will communicate with after-school families whether or not they will remain open that day. The <a href="Google calendar">Google calendar</a> will also say whether after-school care is available or not.

#### **Carpool Routes**

Please review our <u>carpool routes and rules</u> before the start of school. You can even stop by before the start of school to "practice" the routes. If a grandparent or other adult will be dropping off or picking up a student, please share this important information with them as well. Understanding our routes and safety reminders ensures the safety of our students and allows the lines to move faster. If someone other than a parent will be picking your child up, please let your child's teacher know in advance. Teachers will have a transportation sheet for you to fill out during Open Classrooms so we know where your child is going at dismissal and who is authorized to pick up your child.

#### **Tuition and FACTS Management Sign-up:**

St. Albert uses an online tuition payment program that is mandatory for all school families. A letter has been emailed to all new families with detailed instructions on how to set up your account. The deadline to sign-up was **June 15**, **2023**. If you qualify for our parishioner tuition rate, please make sure our Parish office has everything they need to bill you the discounted rate. The non-parishioner rate will be billed until they receive all necessary information. #### **Bus Transportation:**

Bus transportation is available each school year, for an additional fee, for Junior Kindergarten through 8th grade students. Junior Kindergarten students must be accompanied by an older sibling in order to ride the bus. Preschool students are not permitted to ride the school bus to/from school.

**Registration has closed for families interested in bus transportation for 2023-2024.** At this time, Miller Transportation is mapping out our most efficient routes while trying to accommodate as many families as possible. If we still have availability on a bus that goes through your neighborhood or a nearby neighborhood, we may be able to add you at a later time, but will not be able to change the actual routes or pick-up/drop-off locations.

If you signed up for bus transportation already, you will receive more information and your stop times a week or two before school starts. If you have any questions regarding your route, you can stop by the Miller Transportation table in the gym during Open Classrooms on August 10th.

#### **Summer Reading:**

Our librarian and reading teachers have put together our 2023 Summer Reading Lists. Junior Kindergarten through 2nd grade have book recommendations, but are not required to read these specific books. However, we do suggest they read throughout the summer whether it is on their own or with a parent. 3rd through 8th grade have required books and books they can select from based on a list provided by their teacher. Students will do projects and discuss the books when they return to school in August. Many of these books can be found at the library, Half Priced Book Stores, or borrowed from other parents. #### **After-School Care:**

Play Café is our JK-5<sup>th</sup> state-licensed after-school program operating to provide our school families with quality childcare after the school day ends, for an affordable cost. Space is limited. Hours of operation are Monday-Friday, 2:45-6:00 p.m. when school is in session. **Currently, Play Café is full.** For Play Café questions, contact Mrs. Ellen Burton, JK-5<sup>th</sup> Play Café Director, at eburton@stalbert.org.

Our Preschool also offers after-school care. If you checked "Full Day with After-School Care" on your New Student Application, then you are signed up. If you checked "Full Day with After-School Care" on your New Student Application OR have already contacted Elizabeth Dallenbach or Victoria Sims about after-school care, you do not need to contact them again.

#### **Lunch Accounts**

Students are welcome to bring their lunch from home or purchase a hot lunch through our school cafeteria. We use the "My School Bucks" online program to manage our lunch accounts. You will need to set up an account later this summer. You can add money electronically through the website (for a small fee) or send in a check made payable to "St. Albert the Great Cafeteria" (no fee). Make sure and label that it's for lunch money if you send a check.

You will need your child's student ID (can be viewed on Sycamore, ask your child's homeroom teacher, or visit the Cafeteria Manager in the cafeteria during Open Classrooms) before setting up the account on <a href="mayerootrogy">myschoolbucks.com</a>. You can also download the MySchoolBucks app and get convenient access to meal balances, purchases, and make payments right from your phone.

Our <u>cafeteria menu</u> is posted monthly on our website. Your child will receive a St. Albert lanyard and student ID once they start. The ID will have a barcode to be used when purchasing lunch from the cafeteria (grades 1-8). Preschool, JK, and kindergarten use a separate lunch form that parents fill out and return to school. Your child's teacher will explain how that works during the parent meeting in August.

Lunch is \$3.40 and includes an entree, various side items, and drink. Even if your child brings their own lunch from home everyday, we recommend you set up a lunch account and put around \$10 on there just in case your child needs it one day (if they forget their lunch). But please know, we will never let your child go hungry. Our cafeteria staff will always assist them.

#### **School Handbook**

We know this is a lengthy document, but we ask that all new families read through our Parent Student Handbook before the start of the school year. Each year we update the document, but notate new changes with a ★ so you do not need to read through the entire document each year. The 2023-2024 version has not been updated yet. That process takes place over summer break. Our Handbook is available on our Website for quick references throughout the school year.

#### **Communications**

Once we add you, Flocknote will send you an email which allows you to verify your information and set up a password to your account. We use Flocknote to send our weekly school newsletter and all other school emails. Before you contact Ken, check your spam folder. We often find missing emails go directly to spam.

- Internal Parents Facebook Group: We post regular reminders and news that you won't want to miss! We strongly encourage you to join this group. You will be sent an email with the "St. Albert the Great Parents & Family" link to join. This is for parents only. The request links are only active for 48 hours (FB rule) so if you click on the link after 48 hours, it will not work. Please join at your earliest convenience.
  - Please make sure and answer the questions when requesting access so we can approve you quickly. It is very important to us that this group remains private and for parents only. If we do not recognize a name or if the questions are not answered, we will not approve the request to be added.
- **Grade Specific Facebook Groups:** We strongly recommend you join your child's grade-specific Facebook group. This is for parents only. We will send you a link to join your specific group(s). The request links are only active for 48 hours (FB rule) so if you click on the link after 48 hours, it will not work. Please join at your earliest convenience. You will be asked to review the group rules and check if you agree with them. In an effort to keep these groups private and for parents only, if we do not recognize a name or the rules box if not checked, we will not approve the request to be added.

#### Other forms of communication that you will learn about later:

• Sycamore School Management System: this is our parent portal that includes important up-to-date parent and student information, homework assignments, family directory, and grades. If you have a child in K-8, you will receive an email from Ken O'Brien with your login information a week or two before school starts. If you have any questions about technology or do not receive an email about Sycamore by the start of school, contact Ken O'Brien, our Technology Director, at kobrien@stalbert.org. Once you activate your account, you can update your contact information and see your child's Student ID (needed to set up their lunch account on myschoolbucks.com) by clicking on the student, then clicking "profile". You can also download the app on your phone so you have quick access to the school family directory (very helpful!!), your child's classes, missing assignments, grades, and homework.

Sycamore is not very important for Preschool-Kindergarten, as they do not use this for homework assignments or grades.

• Tuesday Folders- weekly papers will be sent home on Tuesday for grades 3-8. Parents should review all contents and sign the folder or papers, depending on teacher preference. Students will need to return their folder the following day. For grades Preschool-2nd, papers will be sent home daily or as needed and will not require a signature unless instructed by the individual teacher. You will learn more about this during 1st-8th Parent Orientation.

#### \*\*UPDATED\*\* Water Bottles

All JK-8th grade students may use a St. Albert approved water bottle during school hours. The St. Albert logo Camelbak bottle is the ONLY water bottle allowed for JK-8. Please come to school with the bottle filled. Flavorings, juice, sports drinks, sodas, or pieces of fruit are NOT allowed in the water bottle. We have water filling stations that can be utilized during the day if needed.

You can purchase the bottles on our website at <a href="https://store.stalbert.org/">https://store.stalbert.org/</a>. Water bottles pre-ordered by Aug. 9 will be available for pick up at open classrooms on Aug. 10 at the SAAM table located in the gym. Bottles will be available for purchase at open classrooms (pending stock availability), but preorder is recommended so we can make sure we have enough available. Bottles ordered online after Aug. 9 will be sent home on Fridays.

Please label your water bottles as they sometimes get lost or mixed up. You can put stickers on them if you would like, as long as we can still see the contents of the bottle. All stickers should be school appropriate. See the Preschool Handbook for information regarding water bottles in preschool.



#### **School Uniform Policies**

School uniforms make getting dressed easier in the morning by not having to worry about what to wear. They also set the tone for the day, represent our school, help remove economic barriers, build feelings of community, and help the students focus on their studies and not their clothing.

**Check out our quick visual for the different uniform options:** <u>Preschool, JK-8, and PE Uniform Options.</u> Please take note that some items can only be purchased at Shaheen's off Breckinridge Lane. Other items can be purchased at most department stores, online, and bargain stores like Target, Wal-Mart, Old Navy, etc.

For detailed information on our uniform policies, please reference the uniform section in our Handbook.

St. Albert has an optional PE uniform that is worn the entire day when the student has PE. Around 50% of the students wear the PE uniform. It is not required. If a student wants to wear the PE uniform, they must wear it in its entirety: a PE top (t-shirt and/or sweatshirt) and bottoms (track pants, sweatpants, or shorts) together. They must be purchased at Shaheens. In addition to the standard PE shorts, there is also a girls version available for those looking for a shorter length/different fit.

If you don't see certain uniform pieces on the St. Albert rack at Shaheen's, ask a sales associate as they can order you what you need.

#### **Uniform Sales**

- Shaheen's is hosting their annual summer sale from June 1-July 5. All uniform items are 10% off in store or online at <a href="https://www.shaheens.com">www.shaheens.com</a> using online promo code: SAVE10. This is a great time to stock up on items at a discounted price.
- Our PTO sponsors used uniform sales throughout the year where parents have the opportunity to purchase gently used uniform pieces for \$.50 \$2.00/each. We will have a sale **July 25th(new families only**), 26th, 27th from 5:00-8:00pm AND during Open

Classrooms/School Expo on Thursday, August 10th from 4:00-7:00pm. New donations arrive daily so some families pop in multiple times.

St. Albert Mama Swap Facebook Group: I encourage new families to join this group, introduce themself as a new school family, and ask if anyone is selling uniform pieces in your child's size. Oftentimes, current school families are cleaning out closets over the summer and are happy to pass along or sell items to new families. #### **Athletics**

You will often hear us refer to "SAAM". That stands for "St. Albert's Athletic Ministry", also known as Sports Ministry. This is the internal organization that handles all sports-related activities. If you plan on participating in sports at any point, please go to <a href="https://www.school.stalbert.org/saam">https://www.school.stalbert.org/saam</a>. Here you can sign up to receive Sports Ministry emails, view the athletic schedules, sign up for a Gameday account, register for sports, sign up to coach, view the athletic handbook, shop for spirit wear, and find resources to help you with all things related to athletics at St. Albert.

Jr. Kindergarten through 8th grade students may participate in athletics. Preschool students (P3 & Pre-K) cannot participate in sports, but we recommend you sign up for communications now so you don't have to worry about doing it a year or two from now.

#### **Spirit Wear**

#### **Spirit Wear Days (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)**

Spirit Days are reserved for Fridays that fall on odd-number calendar dates during the academic year. These dates will be listed on the school calendar and reminders will be sent via the internal Parents Facebook page.

Students who choose to participate may wear a St. Albert spirit shirt, spirit wear shorts and/or St. Albert spirit socks. Spirit wear shirts are shirts that are purchased on our spirit wear website, walk-a-thon shirts, field day t-shirts, athletic jerseys (tanks must have a t-shirt under them), academic team shirts, St. Albert specific cub/boy/girl scout shirts, etc. All new students will be

given a t- shirt before school starts. They may wear them on Spirit Wear Days. Students may choose to wear the optional PE uniform <u>in its entirety</u> or may wear the PE uniform t-shirt or sweatshirt with regular uniform bottoms. See the school handbook for further details. Go Vikings!

#### **KidMail**

KidMail is a great way to communicate with various people within our school and parish building. If you need to send something such as lunch money, parish or school documents, permission slips, teacher notes, etc., simply place your note/documents in a sealed envelope marked the following way (see examples below) and we will make sure it is delivered to the correct person. We get a lot of KidMail so it is very important that you label your envelope, especially if there's money inside, so we can get it to the right person.

#### Absent or Change in Dismissal (JK-8)

If your child is going to be absent for the day, please call or email the school office that morning. You can even leave a voicemail on our answering service before 7:30am. We encourage you to email the homeroom teacher so they are aware as well.

We encourage families to make doctor appointments after school if possible; however, we know it's not always easy to do so. If your child needs to be picked up early or has a change in dismissal for whatever reason, please email the homeroom teacher AND school office (Amy Baker abaker@stalbert.com) as early as possible that day. If any changes need to be made after 2:00pm, please call the school office at 425-1804. The office can get pretty hectic in the afternoon and teachers may not have an opportunity to check their emails after lunch. *Preschool absences, changes in dismissal, doctor's appointments, illness policies, etc. can be found in the Preschool Handbook after July 1st.* 

#### **Lost and Found:**

Our lost and found is located next to our internal school office doors and Mrs. French's office in the primary hall (the hall by the cafeteria that connects the school/gym parking lot to the church courtyard/prayer garden). You can always stop by to look through items before/after Mass on the weekends or by entering the school office entrance before, during, or right after school during the school year. Students can also stop by before the bell rings at 7:50am or ask their teacher if they can visit the lost & found during certain times.

We do purges during all major breaks like Christmas Break, Spring Break, and Summer Break. All remaining items will be donated to the PTO Used Uniform Sale, donated to local charity organizations, or thrown away. Please label all items (jackets, uniforms, lunch boxes, water bottles, etc.) with your child's name. If you receive uniform pieces from other students, make sure to cross out their name and add your child's.

#### **Ready to Get Involved?**

The very best advice we can give you as a new school family is to get involved. It sounds so cliché, but studies show that being involved in your child's school leads to better student behavior, higher academic achievement, and enhanced social skills. And equally important, it helps support all the different functions of our school, allows you to share your own ideas, build relationships with our faculty and staff, meet other parents, and build a sense of community. At St. Albert, we pride ourselves on having a friendly, active and involved parent base. Volunteering will make the transition to a new school so much easier. - **PTO** our parent teacher organization consists of dozens of committees and positions available for parents to participate in. Some require very little time and effort while others like executive chair positions and large events like our Gala, Field Day, and Walk-a-Thon, take more time and planning. #### **Volunteer Requirements**

The Archdiocese of Louisville is committed to ensuring that all children and youth who worship, study or participate in school or church-sponsored activities can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible. In an effort to fulfill this commitment, all employees and volunteers who have contact with children or youth (18 and under) for **ANY** length of time are required to participate in one of the 2-hour Safe Environment Training Workshops. This includes, but is not limited to those who volunteer in a classroom, are room parents, chaperone field trips, coach academic or athletic teams, lead Scout troops, etc. must have:

- 1. A background check performed by St. Albert OR any local parish by "Selection.com", which is good for five (5) years. To start this step, please send a \$15 check payable to "St. Albert" to Larry Brunner in the parish office with your full name and email address); AND
- 2. Attend "Honor Thy Children" Safe Environment Training. Honor Thy Classes are available at a variety of schools. Right now there are limited options, but they will add more dates for after July. St. Albert usually hosts at least one class. Each session lasts about 2 hours. We recommend parents and involved Grandparents attend. Space is limited with no advanced registration so we recommend you attend early to ensure you fulfill these requirements before school starts. <a href="IMPORTANT">IMPORTANT</a>: No one under the age of 16 will be admitted to the training, this includes infants.

### **Building Terminology on Campus:**

**PLC**- Parish Life Complex. Also known as the Parish Life Center. It is the newer building connected to our gym and Preschool-Kindergarten building. It includes a lobby and 3 meeting rooms that are used for Parish and School activities and meetings.

**Hendricks Hall**- this building sits behind (and is connected) to the PLC and is home to 8 Preschool, Junior Kindergarten, and Kindergarten classrooms. You can access this building through the PLC front lobby (or the side doors in between the gym and Hendrick's Hall when picking up for preschool after-school care).

Willet Hall- our gymnasium

**Sacred Heart Center**- the site of our rectory many years ago, this building has been remodeled and now includes our current church nursery, two multi purpose meeting rooms, and a room dedicated to our school Reading Specialist. The SHC is a stand-alone building across from our cafeteria, next to the parking lot.

**Visitation Hall-** our school cafeteria and sometimes the site for various Parish and school activities.

**O'Bryan Center-** our Parish and School Offices. Used to be our old church.

**Viking Room**- located above the gym. You enter the main gym entrance and take the steps to your right up to the 2nd floor. The Viking Room is a multi-purposes room used by the Parish and school.

**Youth Group Room-** Our recently remodeled Youth Group Room is also located above the gym. It is located across from the Viking Room. The Youth Room can be accessed through the gym or the PLC lobby steps.
