Safety Update from the Ohio School Safety Center:

As many of you are already aware, a lot of our students spend a lot of their time watching Tik Tok videos. For those of you that are less familiar, TikTok is an extremely popular social media app designed for watching and creating videos. The Ohio School Safety Center (OSSC) has learned of new social media challenges that impact Ohio schools and, specifically, staff and educators.

As with most social media challenges, these activities have escalated to monthly challenges, which involve varying degrees of inappropriate behavior. I felt it was appropriate to share with staff and family so we can work together to protect and educate our students on making informed and productive decisions.

Here are the monthly challenges that are being advertised on Tik Tok:

September: Mess up a toilet/vandalize restroom **February**: Mess up school signs

October: Smack a staff member on the rear end

March: Make a mess in school courtyards

November: Kiss your friend's girlfriend/boyfriend April: Grab some eggs

December: Deck the halls and show your "b****" May: Ditch Day

January: Jab a breast June: Flip off the front office


This type of behavior will have consequences and may include our school resource officer as many of these behaviors are against the law. We understand the pressure social media and friends may put on these challenges so we are asking for your support and assistance in promoting positive behaviors and decision making for our students.

Ohio School Board Association (OSBA) Statement on the National School Board Association's (NSBA) letter to President Biden

Last Wednesday, the President and Interim Executive Director of National School Boards Association (NSBA) sent a letter to President Joe Biden that included examples of harassment, intimidation, and threats of violence against school board members, teachers, and workers in our nation's public schools – including examples involving OSBA's members. The letter characterized these acts as the potential equivalent to "a form of domestic terrorism" and further called for the assistance of federal law enforcement.

On behalf of the Midview Board of Education, I just want to thank our parents and community. Our Board meetings this year have been respectful and even when there have been differing opinions, presenters have been articulate and thoughtful when sharing their thoughts. I have come to expect and am very thankful for our community for understanding that our Board members, administrators, and staff members work very hard to make decisions that will positively impact students daily and I
