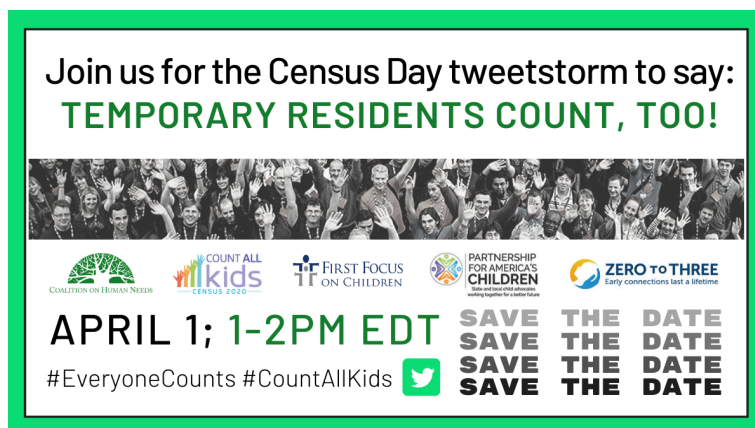

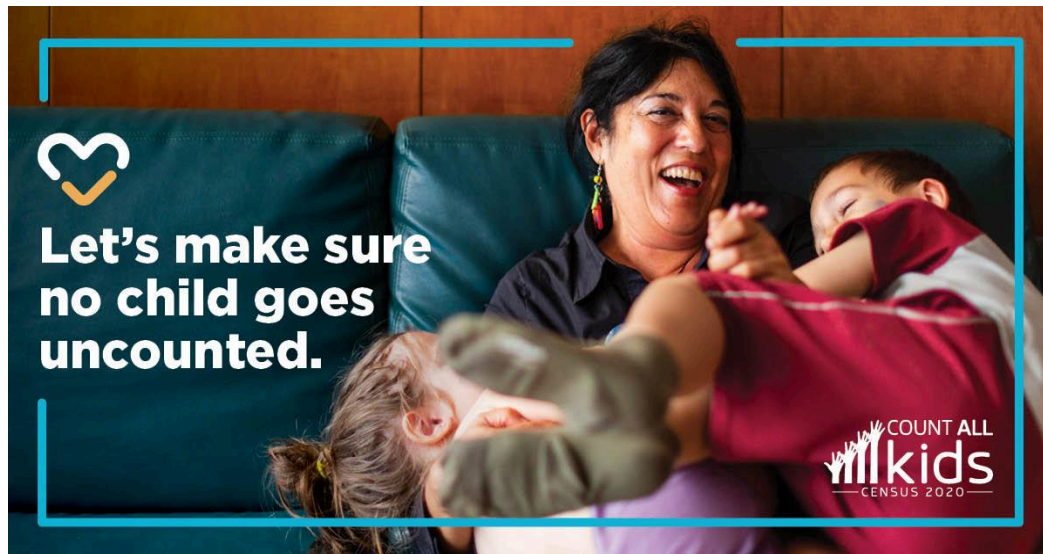
Tweet 1:

April 1 is Census Day! If a child is staying with you on this day and has no permanent address, make sure you count them on your form. Get more information at 2020Census.gov.

When you count all the children (temporary residents TOO) living at your address in the Census, programs in your community—like child care and food assistance—get more of the funding they need. Get more information at 2020Census.gov. **#2020Census #CountAllKids**

Tweet 3:

Is a child staying at your address temporarily? If they have no other permanent address, you should include them on your Census form. Get more information at 2020Census.gov.

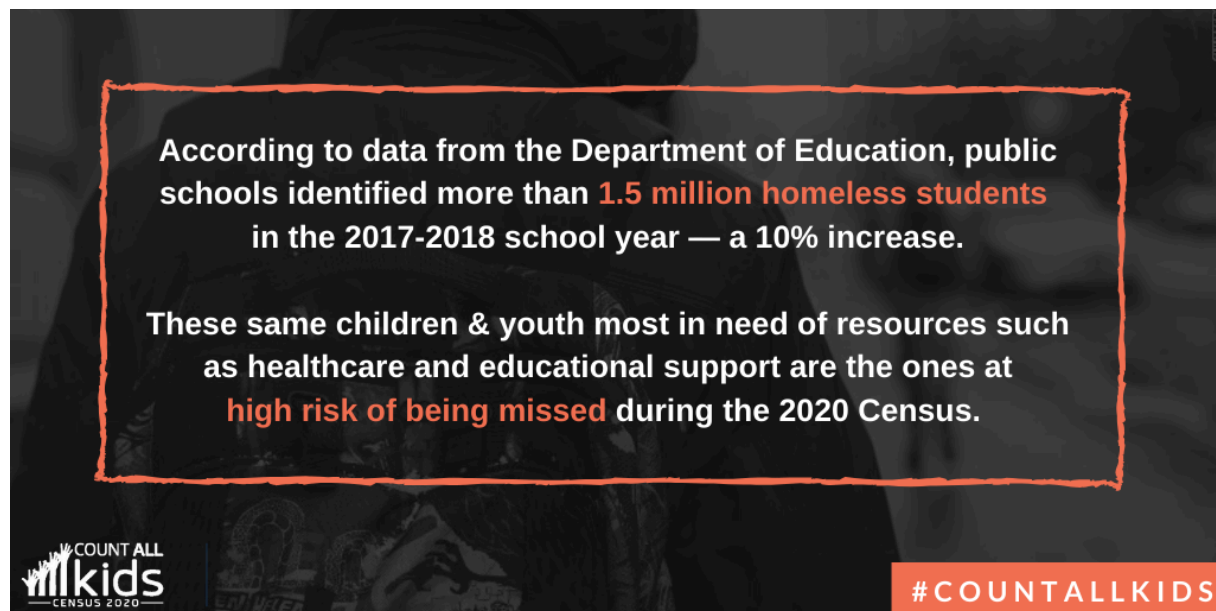

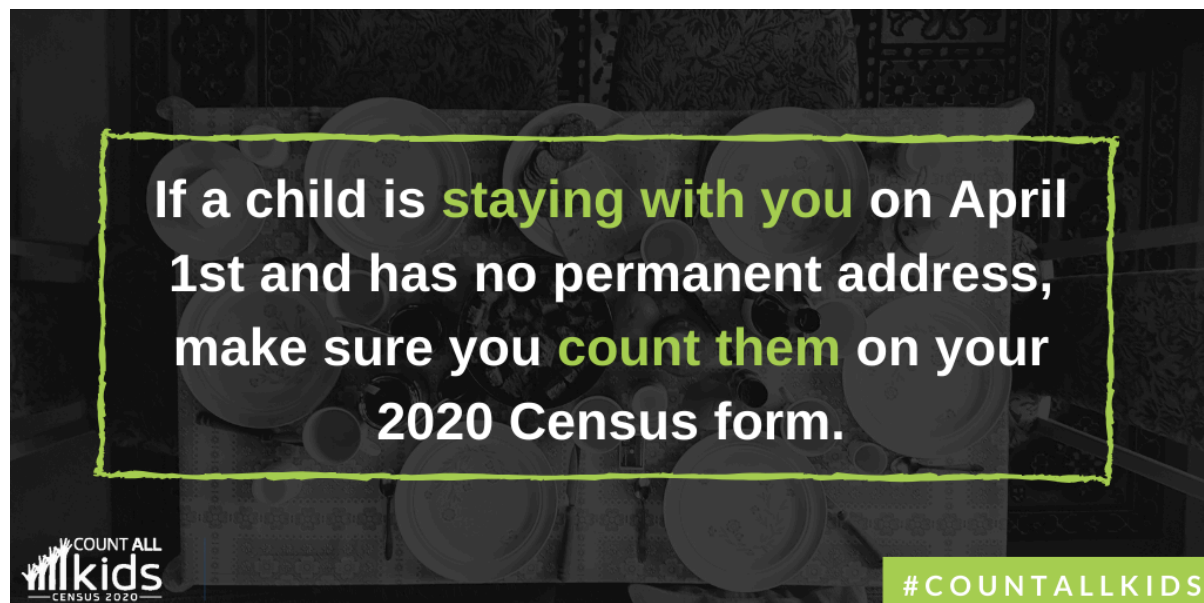

How many is your table set for tonight? If you have children staying with you — and they have no permanent address — you need to count them in the #2020Census. #CountAllKids

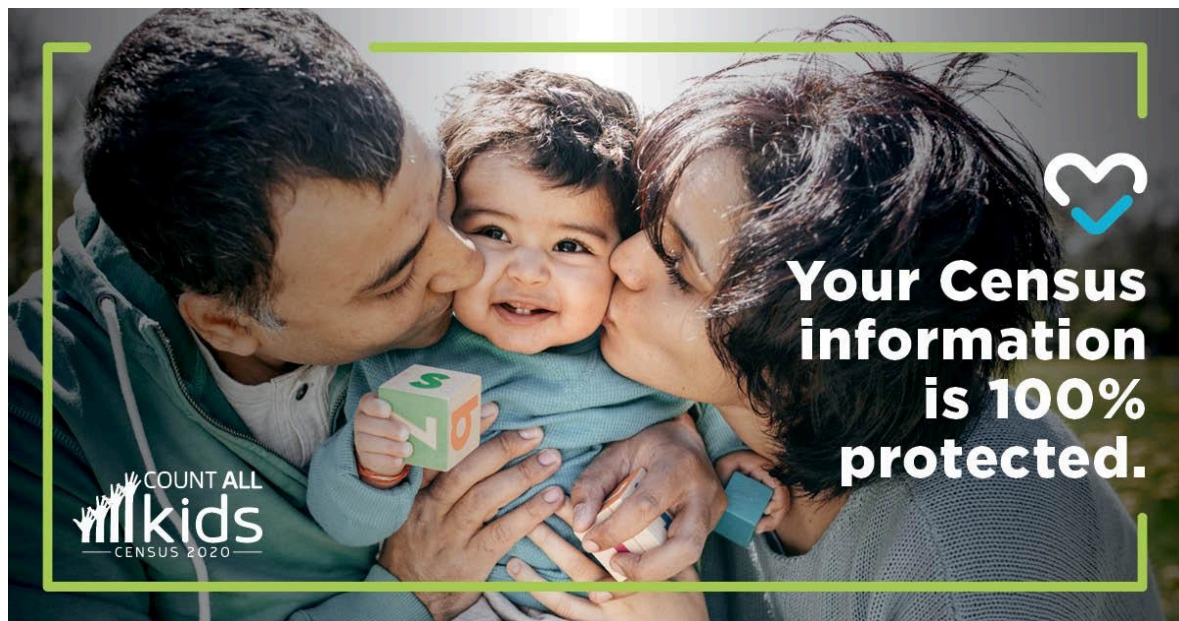

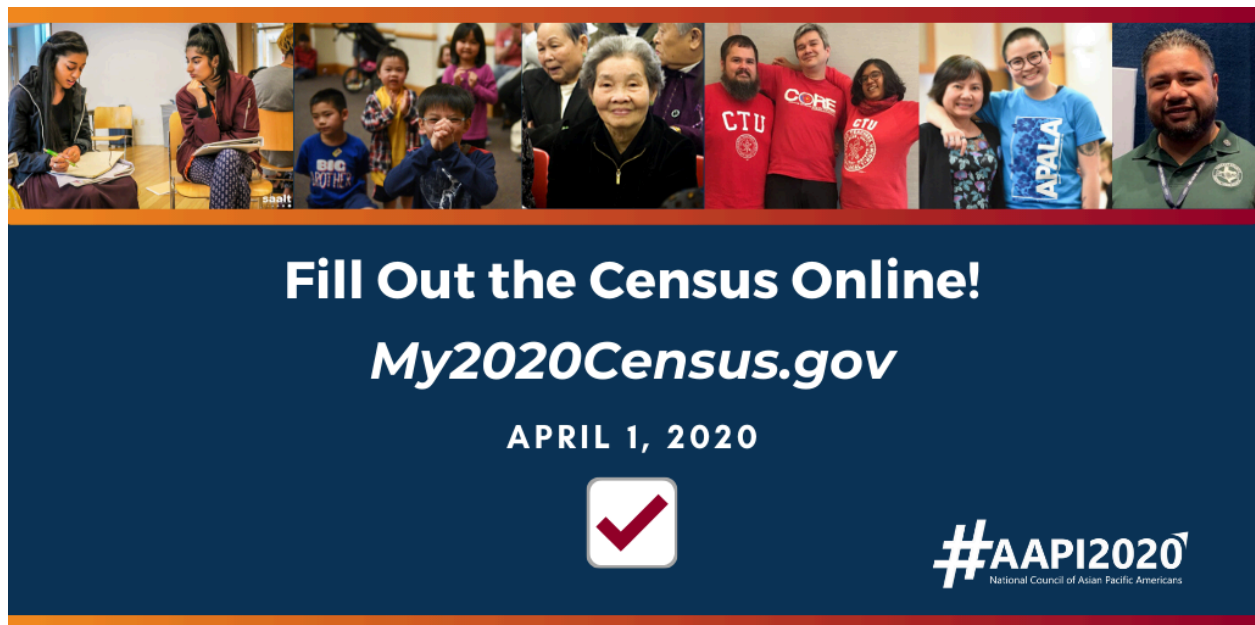
