Application Guidelines

Applicant must:

- be a graduating high school senior with a plan to continue education at a university, college, community college, technical college or trade school.
- have attended Parkview Elementary School for 3 consecutive years and/or all of 5th grade.
- have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Applicant must include:

- Completed 'Parkview Elementary School Alumni Scholarship Form'
- Copy of college or trade school acceptance letter
- Recommendation letter from a high school staff member, employer or other person who knows the student well (not a family member or friend)
