<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> All graduate students, regardless of emphasis area, are required to take a fifteen credit music education core curriculum which includes a culminating research/teaching project. As part of the core, graduate students will defend their final project and successfully complete a comprehensive examination.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> All graduate students are required to complete a course in music theory and music history which will cover advanced topics in each subject. Before enrolling in courses, new students must pass the graduate music history and theory examinations. Students with unsatisfactory scores in music history and/or theory will be required to take remedial courses which do not count towards the degree. MUS 703 and 704 require a grade of "B" or higher.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> MUED 780 and MUS 711 may be repeated for credit if different topics. MUS 625 may be taken multiple times.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> No more than two grades of "C" will apply towards the degree. No grades of D or below count towards graduate credit. As noted in the UTM Graduate Catalog: "Graduate students are required to make an overall minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.00 in courses taken for graduate credit. The cumulative GPA for graduate students is based on graduate coursework taken at UT Martin."
