

Dear Parents,

What a wonderful week of remote learning it has been. Well done and thank you to both parents and students for working with teachers to get through a successful week of Remote Learning 6.0. We are exceptionally proud of the hard work and dedication the children are showing. The children are constantly exhibiting perseverance, dedication, and resilience. As teachers, we understand that at times enthusiasm and engagement can waiver however we are observing a growth in maturity and independence in our Year 3/4 students.

Currently, children are attending <u>2 Google meets at 9 am and 1130am</u> to engage in learning activities for reading, writing, and maths, play educational games, and participate in wellbeing check-ins. Can we please remind parents that ALL children are required to join both google meets and stay on till the end of the whole class session. We understand that children may need to leave to do something with siblings or family members and we just ask that the child courteously inform their class teacher that they are leaving, just as when leaving the classroom or talking to someone on the phone.

As of Monday children will be required to join an additional small group reading conference once in the week. This will allow teachers to listen to children read individually and discuss reading goals and strategies.

Next week specialist lessons will be on Tuesday 17h August to allow for classroom teachers to plan for the duration of this lockdown.

Please remind your child to share their work with their class teacher. We love seeing their work. It helps us plan future lessons and activities to the point of need as well as celebrate their hard work and success.

As always we appreciate feedback and communication. We are very grateful for the kind words we have received from some parents. Class teachers spend the afternoons and specialist days planning, creating lessons, providing feedback, and assessing children's work. This is a lengthy process that can take a number of hours each night. The feedback is a chance for the students to feel a sense of achievement from their day and in some cases, can be critical for the next step of their lesson. We ask for your understanding as we work on getting back to you in a timely manner.

As always we ask that if you have any questions or concerns regarding the daily timetables etc. please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher. We acknowledge that it is an extremely trying time for adults as well as students. If we can provide any additional support or if you feel there is any information we need to know please contact your class teacher, Head of wellbeing Mrs. McNamara, or Mr. Flanagan so we can support you. We are here to help.


