Hello and welcome to Brill! To the several families coming here from Ukraine, we're looking forward to greeting you as part of our community, to offering our friendship, and hope that you feel safe, happy and at home with us during your time here.

Leaving your home at a time of war and coming to a different country will of course be challenging. At times it will be strange, difficult and confusing. To help you settle in, your hosts will be your first line of support and information.

However, as well as the help you'll get from your hosts, we've put together this short Welcome Pack with information about our community. We hope it helps you either prepare for your arrival or, when you get here, to settle in and find your way about.

Brill in a few words....

Who are we?

We're a village on the top of a hill, with a lively and close community of all ages, home to around 1,000 people.



In Brill you'll find a primary school, two stores, a post office, a butcher's, two pubs, a sports and social club, a beautiful old windmill, a doctor's clinic, two churches. a playground, a fire station, children's clubs, as well as other clubs and societies for coffee meetings, making friends, lunches, cinema, theatre and sports. Where are we?

We're in the county of Buckinghamshire, 10 miles from Oxford, and about 50 miles north west of London. Market towns Thame and Bicester are about 15 minutes by car.



Important Admin stuff - how do I get started?

You'll find you have to work through many admin matters and fill in forms after you arrive. It will probably look confusing at first. Where do I start? How do I register? What forms do I need to complete?

Transport and getting about

Your host will be able to advise you on your best transport options, including these.

Buses for Public Transport. The bus stop is the Square in Brill - see map. The limited routes which serve Brill are listed below (these are separate from the school buses):

Bus 112 Brill to Thame, Wednesdays and Fridays: Leaves at 09:35 to Thame. Returns from Thame at 13:06. The journey takes 25 minutes.

Bus 113 Brill to Thame, Tuesdays and Thursdays: Leaves at 09:27 and 11:26 to Thame. Returns from Thame at 11:05 and 13:00. Tuesday there is an outdoor market in Thame.

Bus 111 Brill to Thame, Mondays: Leaves at 09:27, returns from Thame at 11:05, 13:36 and 18:22.

Bus 111 Brill to Aylesbury, Mondays: Leaves at 09:27, 11:26. Leaves Aylesbury at 13:10. Also 16:00 and 17:45 in school holidays. Aylesbury is a larger town than Thame. The journey takes approx 40 minutes.


School Buses to Secondary Schools

The Grammar School in Aylesbury uses the Red Rose service (109) and leaves The Square at 7.20 a.m.. The bus to Waddesdon School is the Motts bus service, and also leaves around 7.20 a.m.. Lord William's School in Thame has two buses, the Heyfordian service leaving around 7.40 a.m. and the Z & S service at 7.48 a.m..

Trains. Nearest stations are Haddenham and Thame Parkway and Bicester North. Both are about 20 minutes drive away, with frequent services to London and Birmingham.

Finding your way around Brill

Brill isn't a huge village, but it might take a while to find your way around.



Schools

The schools in the village are state/government schools, so you do not have to pay for them.

Brill Primary School is for children aged 4 or 5 to age 11. The majority of children living in the village attend Brill School. They are expecting Ukrainian families and you can contact them to speak about a place for your child. The head is Mrs Louise White, the email address is:

In the first instance it is likely to be the school administrator handling your query.

There is also a pre-school in Brill, which generally takes children from age 3-5:

This 'school' is mainly about play and learning through play for younger children.

For children 12 and over there, most go to either the state schools Lord William's School in Thame, or to Aylesbury High (Girls) or Aylesbury Grammar (Boys).

Brill Stores

The main shop in the village. Mahesh is open every day of the week, with a wonderful range of fresh vegetables, groceries, freshly baked bread, wine and beers.



Constable's Shop and Post Office

Our newsagent, shop and post office. Brian will help you out with any postal matters. You can also withdraw cash using a standard UK bank debit card.



Pointer Butcher's Shop

Next door to the Pointer pub, Jon is open on Thursday and Friday afternoons and on Saturday morning for every seasonal mix of meat, poultry and game.



The Pheasant Pub

“Cheers!” says barman Christian. With a terrace and seating looking out over the windmill and towards the west, the Pheasant has wonderful food, wines and beers. Open every day of the week.



The Pointer pub

In the centre of the village, the Pointer has an excellent restaurant, a wide selection of drinks and a delightful garden at the back.



Brill Sports and Social Club

Jo looks forward to welcoming you to the Sports and Social. It's where the village meets for sports and club events, socialising, games, quizzes and other social occasions.

... Things to know about walks in the countryside

There is lovely countryside all around Brill, and you'll always see people out walking. However, one difference between Ukraine and the UK is in private and public access to land.

Roads and paths in villages are generally public. In Brill we also have Brill Common, which stretches either side of the windmill and to which everyone also has public access. Your hosts will show you this.

In the open countryside, unless shown as private, roads and lanes generally allow public access. Fields, woods, rams and other land are generally private land, and public access is only permitted along the signposted public footpaths and bridleways. These are indicated with signs such as the ones below.
