Now that you have finished reading the book you chose at the beginning of the semester, it is time to do your summative based on that. This assignment constitutes **15% of your final mark**, so it's crucial to dedicate time and effort to ensure the best results. You have one month to submit the assignment. Follow the steps below before starting the assignment. You may skip some steps since you will not be doing a written version of the summary. You may write comments in the form of sentences or speech bubbles.

Read carefully: Start by thoroughly reading the book. Take notes as you read to jot down important points, key events, character descriptions, and any other relevant information.

Understand the Main Idea: Identify the main theme or message of the book. What is the author trying to convey? Understanding this will help you focus your summary.

Outline: Create an outline for your summary. Divide it into sections such as introduction, main plot points, key characters, and conclusion. This will help you organize your thoughts and ensure you cover all the important aspects of the book.

Introduction: Begin your summary with a brief introduction to the book. Include the title, author, genre, and any other relevant information such as the setting or time period.

Summarize the Plot: Write a concise summary of the main plot of the book. Focus on the most important events and developments in the story. Avoid including too much detail or getting bogged down in minor subplots.
