

Littoral plants maintenance request form

Any of the native littoral plant species (Alligator-Flag, Jointed Spikerush, Giant Bulrush, Soft-stem Bulrush, etc.) installed in the lake that happen to overpopulate around any of the docks may be thinned or removed (& re-planted), as approved by the Lakes Board, to maintain access and clearance for boating, angling, etc.

Littoral plant removal and planting is a strenuous and potentially hazardous operation to both people & wildlife and is best left to the professionals.
