Does historical evidence support the theory that the Nazis were responsible for the Reichstag Fire?

There is little direct evidence that the Nazis set the Reichstag Fire, but much of the evidence used by some historians to argue Van Der Lubbe acted alone is weak or questionable.

What have you learned about your topic since your first reflection meeting with your supervisor? (summarize main points - 100 words max.)

Simkin's evidence (based on the work of Fritz Tobias) is not nearly as solid as Simkin thinks. According to Hett, Tobias was a Nazi-sympathizer and fraud who intentionally buried evidence that contradicted his claims. Primary source newspaper accounts from England immediately after the fire blame the Nazis. Shirer's account in his book asserts many details as facts that may not be true (such as the SS using underground tunnels to enter the Reichstag). Hitler appeared genuinely surprised and angry to witnesses, suggesting he did not know in advance. Modern fire experts doubt the conclusions of the official report from 1933.

What do you still need to find to be able to answer your research question? (Sources? Types of information?)

I need to locate and read Tobias' original book on the Reichstag Fire.

I need to locate and read the transcripts from Van der Lubbe's trial (primary source) I need to locate and read the transcripts from the Nuremburg Trials that relate to the Reichstag Fire.

I'd like to find a source about Shirer later in his life (interview? autobiography?) to see if he still believed his fire theory after most historians doubted it.

I need to read more reviews and other historians' reactions to Hett's book.
