The application pack should consist of eligibility and related testimonials, and technical documents.

PART A: TERMS OF REFERENCE AND INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS

1. BACKGROUND

DanChurchAid (DCA) is a Danish faith-based, non-missionary development and humanitarian organisation. We work for the poor, vulnerable and socially excluded communities and believe in life before death. Our everyday work with development and humanitarian aid strives to help the oppressed, neglected, and marginalised groups in our focus countries in Asia, the Middle East, and Africa to strengthen their possibilities of a life in dignity. DCA is committed to promoting rights-based approach, gender equity, and climate actions throughout our programme areas.

In Nepal, DCA is implementing its new five-year strategy between 2022 and 2026, during which it expects to implement several projects mainly funded by its headquarters, institutional donors and foundations. DCA Nepal's priorities for this strategic period covers three thematic areas: (1) Fight Extreme Inequality; (2) Build Resilient Communities; and (3) Save Lives. We have two cross-cutting commitments namely (i) Climate Action and (ii) Gender Equality.

Partnership is at the heart of the DCA's mandate. DCA works closely with national/local partners, social movements and community groups who are generally in the best position to know and assess the local context. The partnership model ensures that our humanitarian and development work effectively target the poor, marginalised groups, women, youth, person with disabilities, indigenous groups, dalit, and that the activities become locally sustainable.

2. OBJECTIVE

To select and establish the partnership with qualified national NGO for implementation of the project as detailed below:

High level outcome: Increase the resilience and safety of the most vulnerable communities, through sustainable and transformative impact.

Intermediate level outcome 1: Enhancing community resilience through inclusion and sustainable approach

Intermediate level outcome 2: Strengthening sub-national government systems for anticipatory action, preparedness and response

Below are the **4 key objectives** focusing on community level and system-strengthening at the Provincial Government (PG) and LG level to improve inclusive anticipatory action, preparedness and response

Objective 1: CBOs and vulnerable communities understand and actively participate in EWS, EA and adaptation

Objective 2: The sub-national system for EWS/forecasting for multi-hazards is strengthened or set up

Objective 3: NDRRMA's and PG's EA and response capacities are strengthened based on data, needs and demand from the vulnerable communities

Objective 4: LG's EA and response capacities are strengthened based on data, needs and demand from the vulnerable communities

In consortium with People in Need, DCA is leading Community Adaptation and Resilience component of Sarathi project funded by FCDO in selected priority provinces. DCA's project have been designed to support and contribute to the overarching early action and climate resilience aims in Nepal to bring significant value and sustainable scale up in reaching the most vulnerable and marginalised communities at risk of multi hazards in Madhesh, Lumbini and Karnali provinces by 2029. To achieve this, DCA and partners will use evidence-based approaches to tailor implementation for building resilience in a systemic way, centred around localisation, inclusion and leveraging fiscal resources to contribute to adaptation across differing contexts in the targeted provinces. DCA will strive to implement measurable adaptation outcome and demonstrate leveraging of local and provincial resources to showcase best adaptation practices that works for all and help their communities build their overall resilience, also focusing on the attainment of National Climate Change Policy, National Adaptation Plan and Nationally Determined Contributions.

DCA and partners aim to work with above 121 Community Based Organisations (CBO) who represent the most marginalised groups in across 3 provinces. Through trainings and sub-grants, they will actively co-design and participate in adaptation and resilience building efforts in their localities. This ambition will also include research and innovation to develop and learn from adaptation that works for all strata of the vulnerable community. The local and provincial government will have a resilience framework in place that can be upscaled to other areas and geographies.

This call is dedicated to the community adaptation and resilience package, and will directly contribute to objective 1:

Community Adaptation and Resilience

The "Community Adaptation and Resilience" component focuses on strengthening adaptation capacity of the most vulnerable and marginalised members of the community including women, person with disability, etc. This approach involves closely working with CBOs to assess the adaptation needs of the vulnerable communities, training them on the climate change and resilience framework and demonstrate adaptation through Nature based solutions through CBO led grant schemes. The project will also work closely with local and provincial governments to develop a

resilience measurement framework and pilot it during the implementation. The Resilience Measurement Framework is expected to support sub national governments understand and quantify resilience- so that it can be replicated with leveraged financial resources in other vulnerable areas as well. The community resilience and adaptation theme will collaborate closely with the Early Action theme and showcase demonstration and construction of various early action and resilience related infrastructures such as safe shelters and flood resilient housing construction.

Eligibility criteria:

- Proven track record of working with communities in the above mentioned 3 project areas (Madhesh, Lumbini, and Karnali) in terms of co-designing and promoting resilience and adaptation solutions such as NbS
- Proven experience of working with provincial and local governments to implement adaptation projects and co design policy documents
- Extensive experience of community mobilisation and proven track record of delivering adaptation related projects with strong grant management experience
- Good reputation as a technical organisation and buy in amongst various stakeholders as an adaptation and innovation focused organisation with good community presence
- Previous experience of working on quantifying resilience and adaptation outcome
- Good technical knowledge on early action and using early warning messages and delivering advisory to help vulnerable communities take early action and enable adaptation
- Able to manage multiple grant schemes, across different provinces and regions at once; ensuring quality delivery with sound in house technical expertise
- Strong engagement with the GoN and other stakeholders to promote inclusion in Adaptation and Resilience, with experience of working with the most vulnerable, at-risk population

National non-government organization with expertise in the specified area, based on packages criteria mentioned are invited to apply.

3. SUBMISSION PROCESS

- i. Potential national NGOs are expected to submit the expression of interest with all the required documentations. Please note that the potential applicants should be ready to implement the project directly without any sub-contracting.

Potential and shortlisted partner will need to undergo DCA's partners assessment process following the standard "Partners Assessment Tool" including the financial assessment checklist.

- iv. Application should be clearly marked with title indicating the Eol Package name **Community Adaptation and Resilience** and submitted to DCA by **05:00 PM on 29 December 2024**.

- vi. The information for application MUST be submitted as per the Eol format and substantiated with necessary supporting documents.
- vii. The proposal should be written in **English language**.
- viii. The **pre- selection process** will include **three steps** i.e. Step 1- **assessment against eligibility criteria**; Step 2 - **assessment of experience and technical document**; and Step 3 - **physical verification of partners office** based on submitted application and documents. The applicant must meet all the eligibility criteria mentioned under part B of this document to enter step 2 i.e. evaluation of the technical document.
- ix. The Eol process shall follow the partner selection guideline and procurement guideline of the DCA.

- xii. The selected organisations will be kept in the roster and be onboarded based on the new projects/proposals and opportunities. The partners shall develop a detail thematic proposal after completion of assessment and validation process and negotiations may be held during the detail proposal development process as and when required.
- xiii. The selected organisations are expected to start project implementation immediately after the cooperation agreement is signed.
- xiv. The applicants shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of Eol. DCA is not bound to accept any Eol and reserves the right to annul the Eol process without prior notification and justification without incurring any liability to the applicant.
