Question 1 (Open Your Heart - E11.6.R1): Read the following narrative: "During the winter of two thousand ten, the local library burned down in a mysterious fire. Years later, a retired librarian confessed in her diary that she had been seen leaving the building with a large bag of rare manuscripts just ten minutes before the alarm went off. She wrote that she 'could not let the treasures be destroyed by the ignorance of the new board members'." **What conclusion can you draw about the cause and nature of the fire based on the librarian's diary? Answer:** Based on the diary, we can conclude that the fire might have been intentionally set as a distraction or a cover-up for the theft of the manuscripts. The librarian's confession about taking the "rare manuscripts" because she disagreed with the "new board members" suggests she took matters into her own hands. This implies that the disappearance of the books was an act of "theft for preservation" rather than a loss in the fire.

Question 2 (Sports - E11.8.R1): Analyze the following scrambled paragraphs about rock climbing: (A) However, the weather suddenly changed, and the granite surface became dangerously slippery for the climbers. (B) Early in the morning, the team reached the base of the mountain, ready to conquer the vertical wall. (C) They decided to postpone the climb to the next day to ensure that no one was put at unnecessary risk. **Reorder these paragraphs and explain the transition of events. Answer:** The correct order is (B) – (A) – (C). The text starts with (B), which sets the scene and the initial goal of the team. (A) introduces a conflict or a problem (the weather change and the slippery surface). (C) provides the resolution to the problem by describing the decision to stop the climb for safety reasons.

Question 3 (My Friends - E11.9.R1): Scan this online article snippet: "The legendary tennis player, Marcus Vane, announced his retirement today. Born in Melbourne in nineteen ninety, Vane started his career at the age of six. He has won twenty Grand Slam titles and is famous for his 'Foundation for Youth,' which provides sports equipment to schools in underdeveloped regions." **Identify Marcus Vane's nationality (based on his city of birth), the age he started his professional journey, and his major contribution to society outside of sports. Answer:** Marcus Vane is Australian (born in Melbourne). He started his journey at the age of altı (six). His major contribution outside of sports is his 'Foundation for Youth,' which helps schools in underdeveloped regions by providing sports equipment.

Question 4 (Values and Norms - E11.10.W1): Write a short essay discussing how social norms regarding technology and digital etiquette have changed in the last decade. Discuss whether these new norms are beneficial or harmful to human relationships. **Answer:** In the last decade, technology has completely transformed our social norms. In the past, it was considered rude to look at a phone during dinner, but today, "digital presence" has become a new norm. While technology allows us to stay connected constantly, it has also introduced "phubbing"—ignoring those physically present in favor of a smartphone. In my opinion, these new norms are a mix of both benefit and harm. On one hand, we can share values and support each other across global borders instantly. On the other hand, the norm of constant availability can lead to stress and a lack of deep, focused communication. Ultimately, the importance of values like "respect for the present moment" should be prioritized over digital distractions to maintain healthy human connections.
