First, congratulations on making your first website! I hope the experience is useful to you, and that you learned something about writing in the public sphere--I wanted to give you some feedback on your work

I see that you made several changes per my last email, which is good--the issues of source use have been taken care of. If you were able to revise further, these are the things I would urge you to work on. Your sense of audience is generally appropriate, though I note that the project needs to be edited for language use and style, and there are some places that could mislead an audience who doesn't know this topic. For instance, your descriptions of the public and private spheres are not quite concrete--one references "women" and one "men," but what does that mean? There is also some misreading in terms of seeing *Love in Excess* as epistolary--it does indeed have letters in it, making it partially epistolary, but this misinformation could be misleading to your audience. And finally, I note that your project is about women writers of the 18c, but you only touch on these two, and in a very general way--this, too, could mislead your readers. You might want to switch this project from being publicly accessible to being private, as a result.

I like how you've included some links in the site; however, the site doesn't include any internal links, which can help you make connections between your points--for instance, how does the epistolary page relate to the pieces on the public and private spheres? Your site is also missing some subpages, and the design could use a bit more work.

Ultimately, I think this was a good exercise for you, though. Your grade for this project is a C-
