Students who are signed up to take AP Exams should make themselves familiar with testing information, including: day/time of exams, locations of exams, what to bring, and other special notes.

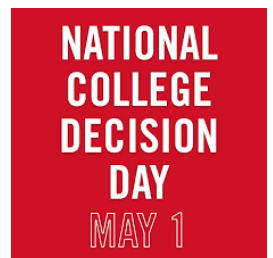
