The Modern Conductor: An Introduction to Wind and Chamber Conducting

Course Description

This is a practical, movement based course. The conducting curriculum will focus on score study and physical movement, tested through conducting labs, practicums, and exams with live musicians. Students will have the opportunity to conduct the Dartmouth College Wind Ensemble, the Hanover High School Band, and various chamber ensembles in rehearsal and/or performance.

Course Learning Outcomes

In this course, students will:

- Develop and/or apply a baseline understanding of music theory that will allow them to access and study musical scores for a variety of instrumentations.
- Develop the physical coordination to effortlessly conduct various beat patterns at a variety of tempos and styles, allowing for specific and interpretive gestures reflecting musical intent.
- Rehearse and conduct a variety of ensembles in a variety of styles, including chamber and large ensembles.

Teaching Methods & Philosophy

While there will be periods of lecture for the presentation of information, whenever possible, the course will be hands-on and student driven. Students should be prepared to take notes at every class period. With notice, students will also be asked to present material, lead class discussions, and provide feedback to one another. Collective, but segmented and separately gradable projects, will be a large component of the course. There will be multiple opportunities for students to conduct and gain immediate feedback from live musicians.

Expectations & Norms

You will be expected to participate actively in group discussions, move (conducting) as a part of a group and individually, and be critiqued and adjusted by Dr. Messier (physical adjustment only with

permission of the student) in front of a class of your peers. Each class period will contain one or more of the following:

- Physical movement
- Musical study and discussion
- Special topic discussion

Class Climate & Inclusivity

Special topics may broach challenging subject matters such as sexism and racism, and while various viewpoints are valued, comments that are hurtful or derogatory towards others will not be tolerated.
