Score 2.0 Simple	There are no major errors or omissions regarding the simpler details and processes as the student: • The student will recognize or recall specific terminology, such as: • fact/opinion, introduction, concluding statement/conclusion, definition, points • The student will perform basic processes, such as: • identify difference between fact and opinion identify facts and definitions in a text write a fact (in their own words) • write an introduction using a model • write a concluding statement using a model However, the student exhibits major errors or omissions regarding the more complex ideas and processes.	For example: • As a class, use a variety of mentor texts/mentor sentences to explore the components of informational writing through mini lessons, such as: • Use strategies (e.g., key word/sketch to stretch) to extract facts from the text and have the students restate/write the facts in their own words • Identify a fact with a definition (Lions live in pride. A pride is a group of lions.) • Model and practice writing an introduction • Model and practice writing a concluding statement
