

COVER LETTER

To Whom This Reaches:

This is documented system failure. A forensic account of what silence does to a life.

My name is Kev. I'm autistic. I have complex PTSD and long-term mental health needs. In 2015, I was enrolled in a coordinated support system designed for people like me — the Independent Living Program (ILP) under the Community Disability Housing Program (ISA stream). It was created for psychiatric stability — not short-term aid. Housing and support were legally meant to function together.

Ruah was my support provider. Access Housing was my landlord.

For two years, the system worked. I started therapy. I saw my children again. I began healing.

Then came the WA–NDIS transition. In 2017, the state signed the agreement. By mid-2018, all ILP clients were meant to be properly transferred under NDIS.


But I wasn't.

Ruah disappeared. No proper NDIS plan. No exit paperwork. No transition of care.

Just silence.

And my entire life collapsed.
