Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Candidates unable to answer for themselves are presented by their parents and sponsors as follows:

Parents and Sponsors: I Present Ella-Elizabeth to receive the sacrament of Baptism.

L: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Parents and Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

L: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

L: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

L: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

L: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

L: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Prayers for the Candidates (kneel or sit)

The celebrant then says to the congregation,

L: Let us now pray for those who are to receive the sacrament of new birth.

A person appointed leads the following litany.

L: Deliver *her* O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Open *her* heart to your grace and truth.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Fill *her* with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Teach *her* to love others in the power of the Spirit.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Send *her* into the world in witness to your love.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Bring *her* to the fullness of your peace and glory.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

The leader concludes.

L: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever.

The Celebration of Baptism (Family comes forward)

L: The Lord be with you

A: And also with you.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

A: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

L: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

The Baptism (Please be seated)

Each person is presented by name to the celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidates, saying.

L: Ella-Elizabeth, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The celebrant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each one saying to each,

L: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The celebrant, in the full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying,

L: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your

Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen

The Giving of the Light - To the newly baptized a lighted candle is given

L: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

**A: Let your light so shine before others
that they may see your good works
and glorify your Father in heaven.**

L: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**A: We receive you into the household of God.
Confess the faith of Christ crucified,
proclaim his resurrection,
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

B'nai Chayim and the Festival of Sukkoth – October 1-15, 2017

Our B'nai Chayim brothers and sisters will be setting up this afternoon in the courtyard for their Sukkah (a tent for the festival of Sukkoth) which will remain during the week of Sukkoth, and be taken down on Sunday afternoon, October 15th, the day after their Simchat Torah service on Saturday, October 14th. During the week they are inviting those of us, who are interested, to come and dine and rejoice with them from 2pm to 4pm and from 7 pm to 9 pm, from Thursday, October 5th to October 14 (seven days, plus the eighth day of Sukkoth and an extra day for good measure). Rabbi Mike or a member of their leadership team will always be on site for these times so that there would be no unsupervised access to the building. Sukkoth is a time when the B'nai Chayim are to have nothing but joy, and remember how their people wandered through the wilderness on their way home to the Promised Land. It also should remind them that believers are only strangers and pilgrims passing through this fading world to our Father's Home in Glory. 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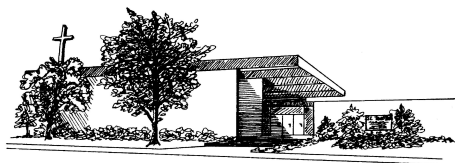
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
