What is abortion?

OS - Abortion is when someone intentionally kills a pre-born human. There are different ways this can look but all of them go against God's design for our lives and families.

YS - Some people don't see the importance of protecting babies who are in their mommies' tummies and try to hurt those babies. We need to help those mommies and babies. God wants everyone to be safe and loved.

What is a miscarriage?

OS - A miscarriage (sometimes called a "spontaneous abortion" in the medical community) is when a fetus (a baby in utero) dies before its born. Miscarriages are no one's fault.

Oftentimes we don't know why they occur. We do know that God loves all unborn babies and gathers them to Himself in Heaven. Miscarried babies are part of our families - our sisters and brothers. It's good to name these babies and talk about them as part of the family. Losing a baby through miscarriage is tragic and can take a long time for a family, especially mom, to grieve that loss.

YS - A miscarriage is when a baby dies before its born. Miscarriages are no one's fault and lots of times we don't know why they happen. We do know that God loves all unborn babies and gathers them to Himself in Heaven. Miscarried babies are part of our families - our sisters and brothers. It's good to name these babies and talk about them as part of the family. Sadness after losing a baby can last a long time.
