#### You need to:

#### Planning:

- Brainstorm (write down all your ideas about the topic)
- Group the main ideas (pick your three main ideas and any related ideas underneath)

#### Start your writing:


- Introduction (introduce your character, set the scene, or topic and inform your reader what it will be about)
- Three paragraphs (follow your plan to make sure that each paragraph has only related ideas)
- Conclusion (sum up your writing, bring it to an end)

#### **Editing:**

- Start by reading your piece of writing out loud to yourself
- Make sure every sentence is complete (needs a subject and a verb/ engine and carriage)
- Add a double line (//)at the end of every idea and check every sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a full stop
- Check that all proper nouns have capitals (Think people, place names)
- Make sure that your tense is the same throughout the writing (e.g it stays in the present tense the whole time)
- Look at sentence beginnings if they are all the same change them or move words around
- Use sentence styles (w-start; preposition start; explore the subject; adverb start; red, white, and blue; power;

- very short)
- Once you have completed your editing, re-read it to yourself out loud
