ABSTRACT (12 Font Size, bold, all caps)

Abstract should be written in up to 250 words and with 11 font size, Calibri, justified, single line spacing. Objective, method and findings are summarized in this section. Do not include citations in the abstract.

Keywords: Keywords regarding the work are stated in this section. Said section should contain a maximum 5 words that are written with 10 font size and separated with commas.

1. INTRODUCTION (Title Calibri, 12 font size, bold)

This document explains and demonstrates how to prepare the OSFS-Meca2026 extended abstract. Please read these instructions and follow the outline of this text carefully. Extended abstracts should be written according to the underlying structure of the structured abstract and in a form that is shorter than the full text. All abstracts should be written in English. Subtitles of the extended abstract should be composed of the sections of **abstract and keywords, introduction and objective, experimental method, results and discussion, conclusion and references.** Extended abstracts can contain figures, tables, formulations or images. Maximum 6 figures/tables can be placed in the extended abstract. Do not indent the text paragraphs. The extended abstract should be preferably written in MS Word format in single-spaced and **11 font size Calibri**. Page margins are formed regarding the A4 page size and are 2.5 cm wide from the right, left, top and bottom. End of the lines should be aligned to the right and there should be no syllable segmentation. **Extended abstracts should not exceed 4 pages including the references** and pages should not be numbered. The extended abstract will be used by the Scientific Committee as the basis for acceptance of the paper for presentation. 2. SECTION HEADINGS

Software and methods that have been used in the work must be stated clearly and sub-headings should be used when necessary. Results of the work and supporting figures, tables and images of the results should take part in the extended abstract. Not having appropriate content can cause disapproval of the sent declarations before the judge's assessment.

2.1. Sub-headings

First degree headings (2.) should be written left aligned, all caps and bold. 2nd and 3rd degree sub-headings (2.1-2.1.1) should be written left aligned, bold and with title case. A blank line should be placed between the paragraphs and there should not be any paragraph indentation.

2.1.1. Tables, Images and Figures

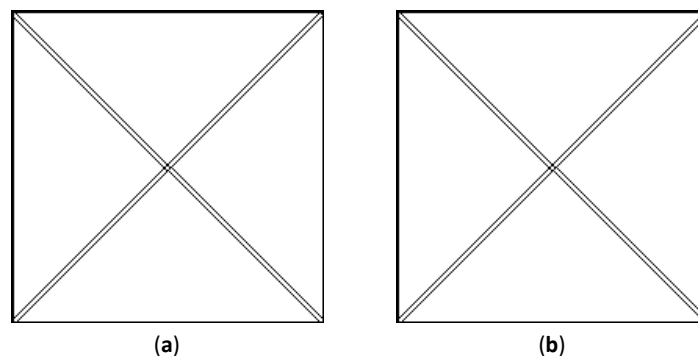


Figure 1. This is a figure. Schemes follow the same formatting. If there are multiple panels, they should be listed as:

All of the tables, images and figures should be centered. Figures and images should be numbered together (Figure 1) and figure definitions should be placed under the figure or image; as for the tables, they should also be numbered (Table 1) and the table header should be placed at the top of the chart. Table, image and figure headers should be written with upper case initial letters, bold and should be centered. References (if any) of the tables, figures and images should be presented just in the tables, figures and images in the form of author surname and publication date.

Figures should be placed in the main text near to the first time they are cited. A caption on a single line should be centered. Note: please refer to the figure in the main text.

References must be numbered in order of appearance in the text (including citations in tables and legends) and listed individually at the end of the manuscript. Two or more references at a time may be put in one set of brackets [3, 4]. References that have been presented in the references list should be prepared in a format according to the reference style shown below (**10 font size Calibri**):
