Who is the intended audience?

To keep the discussion focused, we're looking for ADs/AULs (or roughly equivalent positions at institutions with different organizational structures) who are responsible for collections, technical services, and related areas. If you're unsure if you're a good fit for the event, don't hesitate to contact us and ask!

Is there a registration fee?

Nope! There is no cost to attend. Thanks to College of Charleston for providing the space for the in-person event.

Do I need to RSVP? Is there a deadline?

Please do, and the sooner the better! That said, this is an informal event, and we understand that you may need time to weigh other confirmed or potential commitments. **We need to know if you will attend in-person by November 5** to finalize the catering order. There is no hard deadline on registration for the virtual event.

Is food provided at the in-person event?

Breakfast and lunch are provided, sponsored by the University of South Carolina and Clemson University. We may organize dine-arounds for dinner (participants would be responsible for their own checks). Let us know if you're interested in the latter when you register!

Where should I stay for the in-person event?

The <u>hotels affiliated with the Charleston Conference</u> are a good place to start. **IMPORTANT!**Hotels in the area book up fast because of the conference. Reserve as soon as you are able.

How far is the College of Charleston's Addlestone Library from the Charleston Conference venues?

The CofC Library is within easy walking or ride-sharing distance from all conference venues. It's 0.2 miles (~4 min walk) from the Francis Marion Hotel, 0.4 miles (~8 min walk) from the Courtyard Historic Marriott, and 0.6 miles (~15 min walk) from the Gaillard Center.

Do I need to stay for the whole event?

No! Although we would love to see you for the full event, you are welcome to come and go as needed (e.g., for scheduled meetings with vendors during the in-person meeting or at your home institution during the virtual meeting). If you do need to leave, we ask that you try to come and go between scheduled discussion topic blocks, or during breaks/meals. Note as well that the in-person event lunch break is two hours, allowing attendees to visit the Charleston Conference Vendor Showcase during opening hours.

Do I need to attend both the in-person and virtual events?

No! But we'd be thrilled to see you at both.

Is CollectUn affiliated with the Charleston Conference?

No! CollectUn is not affiliated with the Charleston Conference, and you do not need to register for the latter to attend the former. We merely thought the timing would be convenient for those who were already traveling to the area. For example, one of our co-organizers, Heather Heckman, does not plan to attend the Charleston Conference this year.
