# **Course Description:**

Music Appreciation & History explores music history through its various stylistic periods, from medieval chant to 20th century music. The course utilizes listening examples of influential composers alongside historical context to gain greater understanding of the growth and development of music. Students will explore artistic ideals and issues related to political, societal, and ideological shifts throughout history reflected in music. No prior music knowledge is required as the course begins with understanding the basic elements of music.

### **Classroom Procedures:**

- Enter the classroom promptly and deposit all personal items in the designated spaces in the room. Place cell phones in the phone chart and all other personal devices (earbuds, tablets, smart watches) in your backpack.

- Be in your seat before the bell rings, ready to begin.
- Remain in your place on the risers unless directed otherwise. For the safety of other students
  and the productivity of the class, students should not be wandering around the room at any
  point during rehearsal.

- **Use Kind Words**: Bullying, harassment of any kind, and harmful gossip will not be tolerated in any form. If you have a conflict with another student that requires intervention please speak to Mrs. Fernandes

- Immediately Follow All Directions: Help make sure the class runs smoothly by following directions and the procedures that have been put in place by Mrs. Fernandes.
- **Confidently Make Mistakes**: No one is perfect! If you mess up, in the music or in life, own it and learn from it! A mistake is just an opportunity to do better in the future.
- Failure to follow classroom expectations will result in redirection according to the sequence listed below.

## New Cell Phone Policies and Procedures at Mauldin High School

Due to a legislative action by the South Carolina General Assembly, the South Carolina State Board of Education passed a new cell phone policy for school districts across the state, which goes into effect January 2025. At Mauldin High School, we are committed to fostering meaningful relationships, reducing distractions, and enhancing focus. While Greenville County Schools had updated our policy last year and this is not significantly different, we want to make sure you are aware of the most notable updates in order to comply with the state, which include:

- All student cell phones and personal electronic devices must be stored in backpacks, lockers, or
  in a location directed by school; this includes smartwatches, earbuds, and all other personal
  electronic devices and accessories. At Mauldin High School devices must be stored in backpacks.
- High school students may not use electronic devices outside of the classroom unless that use is
  for instructional/school-related activities as approved by the school, such as checking grades,
  emailing teachers, referencing their schedule, using the phone to pay for lunch, etc. This will only
  be permitted during your student's scheduled lunch time in the atrium.

In this class, all backpacks will be placed along the wall closest to the filing cabinets when in the chorus room. When in the Music Appre room all backpacks will be places along the wall where the whiteboards are.

## **Intellectual Honesty and Plagiarism Expectations:**

- Students are expected to do their OWN work at ALL times. Any acts of intellectual dishonesty, such as having someone else complete work, or plagiarizing a source will not be tolerated. Upon an infraction, the student may receive a 0 on the assignment and the teacher will notify the student, parent, and administrator.
- This agreement is extended to include any inappropriate use of Artificial Intelligence (AI).
   Teachers have reviewed appropriate and inappropriate usage of AI during the first days of school.(see below). The same consequences will apply to the inappropriate use of AI as it is a form of plagiarism.
