- 4. ACCJC Annual Report including Institution-Set Standards and Stretch Goals for the following metrics:
 - Transfer
 - Associate Degrees
 - Certificates of Achievement
 - Course Completion
 - Licensure and Job Placement (CTE only)

The committee engaged in robust discussion regarding current data (submitted to ACCJC by 4/8). The discussion focused on the increasing numbers for achievement in many areas, despite decreasing enrollment.

- For credit certificates:
 - There are more certificates to earn, including many certificates of accomplishment that were converted to certificates of achievement.
 - Total units in many certificates were lowered in recent modifications.
 - o Completion Center efforts have continued.
 - Some students coming back to get certificates during pandemic, potentially related to awareness of certificates highlighted during the pandemic, i.e., encouraging messaging for students to "finish."
- For degrees and transfer:
 - Are more students transferring without degrees? Maybe, although degree and transfer trends track.
- Only licensure and job placement are currently expressed as percentages. For other metrics, the committee may wish to revisit the question of counts versus percentages now that ACCJC reporting allows percentages as an option.
