Cait Kreinik contacted me the other day because she saw a Gedmatch connection to my sister's results.

She gave me some information about her family mysteries, and I followed up with some research. In the course of my research I came upon your trees, including your note, "There is a third Bertha Kreinik, married in 1911 to Morris Levy."

The marriage records for Bertha Kreinik 1911 (to Morris Levy) and Bertha Kreinik 1916 (to William Welinsky) show Bertha's parents as William Kreinik and Sarah Weinstock (1911) and as Wolf Kreinik and Sarah Wenestork (1916). Since the information was transcribed from the original photos (which I have not seen or ordered), I think that it is a safe assumption to understand "Wenestork" as a mistranscription of Weinstock. Thus, our Bertha Kreinik appears to have married (at least) twice. I have included the links and transcriptions below my signature.

I have also found William and Bertha in the Bronx in the 1920 US Census. He is dealing in fruit there—just as William Cohen is shown as doing in Edwin's 1930 birth record. They are on lines 73-74, here <a href="https://tinyurl.com/ybqx2p3u">https://tinyurl.com/ybqx2p3u</a>.

I hope that this info will help move our research forward!

I am also sending you a link to the private tree I began (on Ancestry) in order to organize my research.

They made up names William Cohen his wife Sarah Cohen to register the birth. In 1948, when Edwin Kreinik, the child, needed an official paper, he asked for a change in the birth certificate to show his birth mother's name, Bertha Kreinik. There was no change to the father's name. Bertha had been previously married to Morris Levy in 1911. We don't know what happened to him. Cait is looking for Kreiniks who have submitted their DNA for analysis to see if there is any level of match, so she asked me for advice about the family .

Aaron's daughter Bertha Kreinik was unmarried all her life. Richard Kreinik remembers her as being very kind. She worked for a theater and would let him to see the movies. He identified her in the photo with Aaron and Josef in Buffalo.



"Some birthday present," he told a reporter. "This may mean two and a half to five for me." He was referring to a possible Jail sentence if convicted. Taylor and Bruno were accused of staging the actual holdup. Beck said the two sat drinking a soda in his store until all other customers departed. Then Taylor flashed the gun and ordered him to turn over the money or "have his head blasted off."

THE YOUTHS were hardly out of the door when Beck was on the telephone notifying police. A Bayside patrol car was nearby and the two patrolmen picked up a description of the youths within two minutes.

As the alarm flashed over the air, Patrolmen Thomas Fleming and Francis Gordon, seated in their car at 82nd avenue and 212th street, headed for Union turnpike to head the bandit car off. They traveled only a block when the car shot out of 212th street and they recognized a youth wearing a plaid shirt in the auto.

THE PATROLMEN gave chase and pulled the car over as they ordered the youths under cover of their guns. Kruger, they said, owned the gun and has been out on parole since March 20 for arrest on burglary charges. Kreinik has been arrested for the theft of a car in Suffolk County. All four were taken to the police lineup and 1hen to Ridgewood Felony Court. Police said Kruger and Kreinik helped plan the robbery and acted as lookouts.

Thank you so much for being so helpful. I wasn't affected by the storm, just lost power for about five days, so we're doing just fine. I joined that geni website but I'm broke and I can't sign up for a real membership so it won't let me view any of your links or do much at all. I think the only way to piece together the rest of my family tree is to get a copy of my grandfather's birth certificate. I tried to contact one of my aunts (my dad has a lot of siblings, it's not just him, so there are a lot more Kreiniks) but I never heard back from her. We aren't very close with any of them. I guess I either have to call and order a copy of it (I don't really even know what that entails or if they'll even give it to me) or call up the old orphanage and see what information they have if they have any at all. Is it a huge process to get a copy of a birth certificate? I hope not.

You know, it's funny, because growing up I was very close with a Jewish girl and I used to

celebrate some Jewish holidays with her and her family. I always felt a strong connection to Judaism but I wasn't raised religious so I've kind of looked a bit into lots of different religions just to see what they're all about. I read that book "the God Code" recently and it had a few parts in it about Judaism and Hebrew in it and it was crazy. I enjoyed reading it and I guess it just spoke to my inner Jew or something. One of my favorite authors is Jonathan Saffron Foyer and he's Jewish, also. I'm so excited to learn more about all of this. Thank you for trying to be a part of it! I really do need to hunt down that birth certificate so we can figure out if our family trees blend together or not.

i've got the number for the office where they supposedly keep the records of the orphanage so i'm going to try to give them a call after the hurricane passes, i suppose. i doubt anybody will be working there on monday since that's when it should be hitting us.

i actually saw a joseph and "anny" listed on the ellis island ship records. they came over in 1909 and they were both married (i'm assuming to each other, but they have her age listed as 15 and his as 40, so that's a little ... unbelievable?) they were the only two listed as hebrew on their records and they came over the same year on the same ship.

do you think we're actually related? i mean, my last name is so uncommon that i can't imagine i don't have a connection to another kreinik, but who knows! it's so crazy to think i have this whole hebrew lineage that i never knew about until now. i would really like to get a hold of the 1950's census which i'm assuming i have to go to the library to do, just to see who my grandpa was living with during that time. i don't think it was the chernucks because the 1952 news article i found listed a different address for him than the chernucks house. he was 21 at that time so it's possible he could have been living alone or something but i won't know until i find out, i guess.

It would be great if you got your grandfather's birth certificate. The Hebrew Home records will certainly show the birth parents, if you can get them to release them.

I have been looking through the Kreiniks to see if there might have been any with family crises around the early 1930s which might have made them send a kid to an orphanage. (There was an event in 1900 when Joseph Krainik and his wife Annie died and left their children to relatives. Their daughter Sarah was taken in by another Joseph Kreinik and went on to marry Isadore Kreinik (a cousin) and they gave birth to Jerry Kreinik, who with his wife Estelle, founded Kreinik Fine Threads. You may have been asked if you are related.)

If you like I can invite you to join Geni where you can fill in the generations of Edwin Kreiniks, and we can try to figure out how we are related. Geni is less expensive than Ancestry and it is much more interactive.

I will copy you on a message I will send to the Kreiniks who are interested in genealogy and may know more than I do.
