

CodeLab is a website where you'll view homework assignments and submit your solutions. (CodeLab was developed by two professors in our department.)

Signing up:

- Sign-up and login instructions are [here](#).
- If you already have a CodeLab account, you do not have to create a new one.
- If you don't yet have an account, sign up for one.
  - When signing up, you may use any email address; it doesn't have to be your school-issued address.
  - The name you provide to CodeLab doesn't have to be the name listed in the Brooklyn College system, as long as I can identify who you are. For example, it is okay to use "Mike" instead of "Michael."
- Once you have an account, you need to access our section. Our section access code is **CUNY-32466-ZEAF-65**

Using Codelab:

- Although it is possible to write code entirely within CodeLab, I would only recommend doing so for exercises that do not ask you to write a complete program, but rather a few statements or a method.
- For exercises that ask you to write a complete program, write the program in an IDE. Any IDE is fine with me, but I'd recommend IntelliJ IDEA.
- When you submit a solution to CodeLab, the site will test it for correctness. If CodeLab finds any mistakes, it will notify you. Unfortunately, the error messages are often unhelpful, so if you're unsure you may ask me. Once you figure out the issue, fix your program and resubmit it. Keep doing this until CodeLab accepts your program.

- You can submit solutions as many times as you wish *without penalty*, up until the deadline.
