
The Spirit of Spiral Economics







Memory Booth <> Connecting Inter-Generational Knowledge-Bearing

The Memory Booth is a concept I began conceptualizing in the Summer of 2020 when, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the longest running street festival in Chocolate City - Adams Morgan Day - had to shift to a mostly virtual space. Under the guidance of that year's Cultural Heritage Lead Margaux Granat, we began thinking of different ways to capture our neighborhood's rich cultural heritage through social media and other virtual interactivity. This led me to a truly remarkable person: Sovereign Nancy Shia

"For forty years, the respected community photographer and local activist Nancy Shia has lived in an apartment on the corner of Ontario Street and Columbia Road.

During that time she has taken countless photographs of the Columbia Heights,

Adams Morgan, and Mount Pleasant neighborhoods.

Ranging from a powerful series of photos of homeless women and men who gathered outside her window and whom she befriended and worked closely with, to numerous photos of the DC Festival Latino Parades that for decades marched outside her window, Nancy Shia has compiled a significant and remarkable collection of a community not only in transition, but one on the verge of being completely forgotten and erased. Her photographs include African Americans protesting against gentrification in the 1970s, the renaming of Rabaut Park to "Parque Farabundo Marti," the decades-long changes to Walter Pierce Park, the growing Afro- Latinx community, and the gentrification of 18th Street and Columbia Road.

Shia's photographs are an invaluable historical archive of Central American, Latinx, Afro-Latinx, and African-American communities that deserve to be remembered and honored."

>>> The aim of this website is to archive and exhibit Shia's collection for use by teachers, students, and community members. These photos, many of which have never before been exhibited, provide an important narrative of neighborhood activities, including local politics, work, community activism, homelessness, immigrant businesses, and the remaking of space over time.

While much has been written and exhibited concerning gentrification, we know little of how and why neighborhoods change over time. What are some of the factors that have allowed gentrification and neighborhood change to happen in the first place? What do we remember, what do we forget, and why?

Unlike other sources, there is a fixed, intransigent quality to photos and photographic archives that cannot be easily mitigated or erased with alternative narratives and interpretations. It is a source that demands to be seen, understood, and historically contextualized. Photos, as historical markers, can and do change minds.

By teaching students how to interpret visual culture, in particular photography to understand historical moments and events, we allow for an opening, a rethinking of how to *see* those things we often take for granted. As students become increasingly invested in visual learning and online courses, Shia's archive of photos can assist teachers with resources to create a different learning experience and to help students understand what are often tedious, layered, and difficult urbanist concepts of change. Students are encouraged to interpret these photos and write their own stories. And finally, the photos are a powerful reminder of the history of immigrant and communities of color in D.C. An active documentation of communities and neighborhoods that are so easily erased by development and convenient forgetting.

>>> Nancy Shia Bio

I began taking pictures of people sitting on a park bench on the New Haven Green in Connecticut during a gap year between high school and college. My first job out of high school was working for Community Progress Inc., a community organization that was part of President Johnson's Great Society Program. My first camera was the Polaroid Swinger. The job gave me the opportunity to photograph people and neighborhoods in New Haven.

Two years later, I was living in New York City and using an Asahi Pentax Spotmatic 35mm camera. I had a darkroom in my apartment and was photographing street life and studying sociology and photography at the City College of New York (CCNY). While at CCNY, Black and Puerto Rican students shut down the college two spring semesters in a row to protest a lack of minority enrollment in the college. Documenting these protests felt like writing history. The antiwar movement was in full bloom, and I began attending big demonstrations in Washington D.C. After CCNY, I studied social work at Columbia University and documented the upper West Side neighborhood I lived in. I also photographed East Harlem, where I was assigned to the legal services office to help

organize tenants, and I began to photograph people actively organizing around housing.

In 1972, I moved to D.C. to go to Antioch Law School. For the first six weeks of law school, Antioch placed students with a low-income family in D.C. I lived in Clifton Terrace with Ma Pat, a community organizer who introduced me to community leaders and taught me a lot about Chocolate City.

The Out My Window Project came about one afternoon as I was visiting with Nancy Shia at her apartment on the corner of Columbia Road and Ontario in Adams Morgan. Recounting decades of photographing events, people, and moments, she turned to me and said, "if you only knew how much I've seen and photographed out my window."

The Out My Window Project is both material and metaphor. Not all of the photos have been taken out of Nancy Shia's window, but the window as metaphor and opening, explains her commitment and passion for photographing her neighborhood and community. She is one, if not the only photographer, to have photographed the same D.C. neighborhoods for close to forty years. That alone is an unparalleled achievement that allows us, the viewer, the rare privilege to witness these communities evolve and change over time.

In a time of continuous and uncritical visuality, a period marked by social media that demands our constant attention and gaze, Shia's photos ask that we see with intention. That we understand the precarity of bygone moments and the tenuous stillness of now. Her photos are a reminder of neighborhood histories and experiences that are continually being shaped and guided by generations of families, communities and networks that all lived, worked, resisted, and played here before and *during* the revitalization programs, gentrification, and economic displacement. Communities made up of African Americans, immigrants from all parts of Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean, and North Africa who called Adams Morgan, Columbia Heights and Mount Pleasant their home.

By taking these photos, Shia has marked and defined historical moments and events. Her photos document political movements, community activism, changing neighborhoods, and shared joy that until now, and with the publication of her photos, we might not have known existed. There, out of her window — both physical and metaphorical — perched with a camera in her hand, Shia has recorded an invaluable and powerful photographic history that eludes the unthinkable and makes visible the truly extraordinary.

Nancy Raquel Mirabal is an associate professor at the University of Maryland, a board member at Teaching for Change, and project director for Out My Window.





Memory Booth <> Offer Artefacts






Example: La Manplesa Film Memory Booth


Justin Bell's Design - first social media outreach and solicitation post


From Justin Bell:

I sketched out some wood pallet art walls, basically cutting a 4x8 pallet in half, turning it upright and putting bracers on the base, then covering the two sides with materials to hide the pallet underneath... one side would have the wood planks behind the print face so screws can be drilled in to hang any art/object brought.. figured the opposite side could have



a collage or other visual thing to look cool. They could be inside the tent or outside in the park space, generally acting as a wall to hang things.. could prob make 2-3. There's a rough sketch of the racks displays, it's basically just an 18x6x1/2 inch acrylic Abel with wood or bricks underneath that can keep the display board elevated off a table, or whatever it's on.. My Home <> Chocolate City <> Occupied Piscataway Territory

I was born in modern-day Iran. My father came to Turtle Island first to prepare our Home there. Somehow, without speaking the language, he instantly made friends and got a job at a gas station. He picked us up from the Los Angeles Airport on September 9, 1990. I was almost 4 years old at the time and hadn't seen him in a year so I was shy and holding back. He gave me a little stuffed bunny that I still have all these years later! Then he took us to our new Home and my parents were determined to Build a Beautiful Life For Us. I grew up and as soon as I was old enough to leave my parents Home with their permission, I set out to See As Much Sacred Land and Its Inhabitants as I could. I traveled all over the world. I climbed Mountains in Morocco, I picked Coffee Beans in Colombia, I Danced Danced Danced pretty much every day. I usually say I lived in "43 Countries" but the Truth is that I Totally Lost Count. I tried and failed and tried and failed and finally learned 1) how to realllyyyyyy stretch a dollar, 2) to take up very little space, 3) use my luck and wit to go wherever my legs could carry me and my small travel bag.

Of all the places I went and all the people I met and all the things that I saw, for some reason my favorite of all is called Chocolate City or sometimes it's called Occupied Piscataway Territory and sometimes it's called washington, dc. I love this place so much its Home with a Big Fat Capital H!

During The Great Pandemic of 2020, I witnessed what I now call "The Great Awakening of the Divine Feminine." No one understands what I mean by it but if I had to describe it in the simplest way it means that You Have the Power to Love Just Because That's What You Choose For Yourself and no one else. I saw this Power AllIllIll Around Me and I'd Felt It In Myself for So Long that I was SOOOO Excited to See SOOOOOO Many Examples of Other People's Power! All Different Shapes and Sizes and Colors of People Dropped What They Were Doing And They Gave Up Everything They Could To Their Neighbors. It Was a Magnificent Time.

Testimony provided by Tara Vassefi for Wednesday, November 10, 2021 hearing Judiciary Judiciary Committee Roundtable on DC Jail Conditions

Hello my name is Tara Vassefi and I am an attorney specialized in the use of nascent technologies and digital evidence for humanitarian and human rights justice and accountability. In my most recent employment, I served as Washington Director of Strategic Initiatives and Legal Scholar for a company called Truepic, that uses

blockchain, computer vision, and AI for digital image authentication. I was removed from that position in November 2019 after I vocalized and sought to correct serious and wide ranging ethical issues within the company. Since the pandemic hit, I've been struggling with unemployment but also relishing in the joy and privilege of working with the DC Mutual Aid Network:

a leaderful Community of neighbors working together to meet each other's basic needs: food/water, health, housing, safety.

Chocolate City, aka Unseated Piscataway Territory, aka washington dc has a long, rich history of Mutual Aid particularly within the Black Church and amongst the historically-segregated neighborhoods East of the [Anacostia] River ("EOR"). To learn more about this history, I would recommend what I believe should be required reading for all District residents and visitors: *Black Food Geographies: Race, Self-Reliance, and Food Access in Washington, DC*

Dr. Reese spent nearly a decade doing ethnographic and empirical research on ~Chocolate Cities and Towns across this country, focusing on this fascinating nexus of race, self-reliance and food access, and she Chose to focus her dissertation on our beloved Home because of the unique lessons and dynamics she observed here.

"Black Food Geographies toggles between macro-level analyses of food apartheid and micro-level analyses of how residents navigate the unequal food landscape... The historical and ongoing significance of race at the intersections of capitalist accumulation, dispossession, and residential segregation requires an understanding of how the geographic distribution of food is a reflection of anti-Blackness and oppression as much as it is about class and economic capital... The increasingly corporatized food system is not simply unequal, it is a by-product of how structural racism touches every aspect of life -- even where our food resources are located." (emphasis added)

This 2020 iteration of Mutual Aid in our City was catalyzed out of East of the River ("EOR") by longtime Black Lives Matter and adjacent activists and it sparked the Spirit of so many people that within a matter of days, neighbors had set up a network of grocery-deliveries to high-risk neighbors that was so speedy, effective, and efficient that the DC Government and Mayor's Covid response initiatives attempted to pass it off as their own. I was among the millions, maybe even billions of people further Activated by the Lynching of George Floyd and spent much of the Summer of 2020 doing Legal Observation and other activities at Black Lives Matter Memorial Plaza. The one piece of video I feel comfortable sharing in this forum from the White-Violence Safeguarded <> Black Bodies Abducted archive is the attached footage from August 28, 2020 at 12:12 am. The context of this footage is that moments before this video, a white man in Blackface descended onto Black Lives Matter Plaza; he came up to me, Tara Vassefi, the one filming this video, and shoved his phone-camera inches from my face and asked "Why do you think Hillary's a lesbian."

There were many people at Black Lives Matter Plaza during that time - many of whom saw the space as a place to meet, connect, empathize, and process the violence they experienced there earlier that summer in the days immediately following the Lynching of George Floyd. It was a particularly unique traumatizing <> healing space for those who had been tear-gassed and assaulted by MPD during those assemblies exercising our First Amendment rights. When the people at Black Lives Matter Plaza saw this white man in Blackface, it was experienced as an assault especially since many of the people there that night and other times of the day and night were Black Citizens communing peacefully and in solidarity in a safe space to dream designs of how to tuck their bodies into the wheels of injustice to stop them from turning while *simultaneously* Building Their Home InTheir Image. Myself and others attempted to peacefully escort him away from the Plaza and as things escalated because he refused to leave, a line of dozens of MPD on bikes emerged

as though out of nowhere, they formed a wall to protect the white man in Blackface and they abducted several Black men in the process - only Black men were abducted. It was so traumatizing that they wouldn't put the white man in Blackface into the police vehicles that were there to remove him from the space. Dozens of MPD officers formed a line with their bodies and their bikes to make sure that the white man in Blackface was kept safe and comfortable in the aftermath of committing this hate crime. When it was deemed safe enough to remove the young white man in Blackface, they gently put him into a MPD vehicle (no arrest or handcuffs) and they drove him to safety.

This video footage depicts the aftermath when MPD officers continued to stand in formation and a witness to this White-Violence Safeguarded <> Black Bodies Abducted recounts what he witnessed to the remaining MPD officers.

I continued to do Legal Observation and other activities at Black Lives Matter Plaza where we would continue to witness over and over again how this violent society and its enforcement mechanism in the form of police state-sponsored violence could not and would not See White-Violence. Visitors to our Home would come to wreak havoc on what they saw as a hotbed of "terrorist organizations" like BLM and Antifa. They were particularly invited by the art and creative expression that blossomed in front of the White House, especially after xxx when president trump tear-gasses protestors to make way for his procession to xxx church and make some kind of a statement to his followers by holding a Bible upside in front a place of worship that since deplored this act of state-sponsored violence.

The number and tempo of these visitors only grew exponentially after Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg transitioned. Shortly after, two Heroines - Nadine and Karen, became the stewards of what is now referred to as the Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence - an open guerilla gallery space dedicated to Black Power, Joy, Resilience, and Vision for Collective Liberation.

I had the honor and privilege of being in a close collective of comrades committed to supporting Nadine and Karen as they lived and guarded the **Black Lives**Matter Memorial Fence https://www.facebook.com/GuardiansOfTheFence/. We all worked together in solidarity to meet the basic needs of Nadine, Karen, the stewards of

the William Thomas Anti-Nuclear Peace Vigil

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/White House Peace Vigil, and the unhoused neighbors who considered the Plaza and its immediate area their residence due to extreme housing injustice in this country's capital.

Proud Boys and MAGA marchers would visit every weekend and here and there throughout the week. Many of them would dress in combat gear with black paint under their eyes. Their public chats and discussions would rally around wild claims that "BLM was bussing in people by the 100s." Mind you, at this time Black Lives Matter DC consisted of eight people <> core organizers who had the good sense to know that these ignorant white supremacists, however misguided, are not the enemy: after Learning and Testing how #WeKeepUsSafe during the two Million MAGA Marches on November 14 and December 12, they *encouraged*

I was at Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence the night of January 5 when the Proud Boys and MAGA were able to get a feel for the Power of breaking through the police officer (human) barricade. It's unclear what they were trying to get to since the only things that were on the other side of the police officer barricade were Nadine, Karen, a handful of other guardians of the Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence, the Fence itself and the White House. And that night marked the very first time that I overheard the officers - who had been tear-gassing, brutalizing, arresting, and abducting protesters for months - expressed any sense of awareness of the threat posed by the Proud Boys and MAGA. I heard them talking to each other about how shocked they were that these people had the gall to break through a police barricade and when one of them saw that I was eavesdropping, he said to me, "you guys were right."

Just after the 6pm Emergency Curfew on January 6, 2021, I sent the following dispatch (https://www.facebook.com/tara.vassefi/posts/10101770874869732) to my friends and family who were furiously checking in and trying to make sense of what seemed very shocking to them. #WeKeepUsSafe

The police and the system that gives them the power to enforce the laws of this society do what they were *perfectly designed*, **from their inception onward**, to do:







The project objective outlined below is to prototype a technology that will streamline a cooperative, circular economy model where members of a Community can have decentralized access to the Collective's resources.



According to inclusive fitness theory, organisms can gain fitness not just through increasing their own reproductive output, but also that of close relatives. In evolutionary terms, individuals should help relatives when Cost < Relatedness * Benefit. The requirements for eusociality are more easily fulfilled by haplodiploid species such as bees because of their unusual relatedness structure. [30]

In haplodiploid species, females develop from fertilized eggs and males from unfertilized eggs. Because

Willing to die for their **issters**: worker honey bees ^{CD} killed defending their hive against yellowjackets, along with a dead yellowjacket. Such altruistic behaviour may be favoured by the haplodipioid sex determination system of bees.

a male is haploid (has only one copy of each gene), his daughters (which are diploid, with two copies of each gene) share 100% of his genes and 50% of their mother's. Therefore, they share 75% of their genes with each other. This mechanism of sex determination gives rise to what W. D. Hamilton termed "supersisters", more closely related to their sisters than they would be to their own offspring.³¹ Workers often do not reproduce, but they can pass on more of their genes by helping to raise their sisters (as queens) than they would by having their own offspring (each of which would only have 50% of their genes), assuming they would produce similar numbers. This unusual situation has been proposed as an explanation of the multiple (at least 9) evolutions of eusociality within Hymenoptera.^{[32][33]}

Haplodiploidy is neither necessary nor sufficient for eusociality. Some eusocial species such as termites are not haplodiploid. Conversely, all bees are haplodiploid but not all are eusocial, and among eusocial species many queens mate with multiple males, creating half-sisters that share only 25% of each-other's genes. [34] But, monogamy (queens mating singly) is the ancestral state for all eusocial species so far investigated, so it is likely that haplodiploidy contributed to the evolution of eusociality in bees. [32]

And I think this is why I felt liberated by the legal pedagogy: a system of non-linear Learning and consistent invitations to excavate in the form of the Socratic Method. I accrued that debt and acquiesced to my parent's immigrant pressures by going to law school but I am grateful that such an institution afforded me the tools and weapons to de-construct the upside-down world aRound me.

That said, I can't remember how I came across this concept. I only have a vague recollection that at some point during The Great Awakening of the Divine Masculine, my typical fascination with Bees turned into an obsession. And it was likely at that Time that my curiosity invited me to this puzzling and mathematical phenomenon in Honeybee Eusociality referred to as "SuperSisters."

I do distinctly Remember the first Time I observed it in the Human-Mammal Species - it was at the Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence...

SuperSisters Swarm The Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence

Throughout the summer following the lynching¹ of George Floyd on May 25, 2020, The Fence, Black Lives Matter Plaza², and the area surrounding the White House became a unique space for creative expression, healing, organizing, and transformation for those activated into the Movement for Black Lives. As the mass protests

transformed³ into
Movement, there was
constant activity at all
hours of the day and
night at Black Lives
Matter Plaza from
large holiday festivals
on Juneteenth 2020⁴,
4th of July 2020⁵ to
regular yoga classes
and art nights.⁶

Meanwhile, police and officers of the other 31 law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction in Washington, D.C. used increasingly violent tactics on peaceful protestors, arrested/abducted countless protestors and supporting humanitarians (those offering free food, PPE, and mutual aid), and repeatedly used chemical weapons⁷ on the citizens they are paid to protect.⁸

Likewise, supporters of President Trump began to visit Black Lives Matter Plaza with more and more frequency around August 2020. Many of these Trump supporters and "conservatives" believed they experienced harm when the nation's capital recognized "Black Lives Matter" in such a public manner. Others came to take pictures and incite a response. For example, on August 28, 2020 at around midnight a white man in Blackface descended onto Black Lives Matter Plaza, walked up to a group of BIPOC people with his camera filming their reactions and asked "Why do you think Hillary's a lesbian?" For many of the community members and DC residents at Black Lives Matter Plaza that night, the provocation of this white man in Blackface was experienced as hate speech and a group of people attempted to usher the white man in Blackface off the Plaza. Within a matter of seconds, a line of dozens of MPD on bikes emerged to form a wall with their bikes and bodies to protect the white man in Blackface. Though MPD arrested several Black men in the process, they continued to protect the white man in Blackface to make sure he was safe. It wasn't until some time had passed and Black men had been arrested that the MPD officers gently ushered him into a MPD vehicle (no arrest or handcuffs) and they drove him off the Plaza. 10

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Hello my name is Tara Vassefi and I am an attorney specialized in the use of nascent technologies and digital evidence for humanitarian and human rights justice and accountability. I have worked on evidence-gathering and investigations in conflict situations around the world including Syria, Yemen, and Sudan. In my most recent employment, I served as Washington Director of Strategic Initiatives and Legal Scholar for a company called Truepic, that uses blockchain, computer vision, and AI for digital image authentication. I was removed from that position in November 2019 after I vocalized and sought to correct serious and wide ranging ethical issues within the company. Since the pandemic hit, I've been struggling with unemployment but also relishing in the joy and privilege of working with the DC Mutual Aid Network:

a leaderful Community of neighbors working together to meet each other's basic needs: food/water, health, housing, safety.¹¹

I was among the millions, maybe even billions of people further Activated by the Lynching of George Floyd and spent much of the Summer of 2020 doing Legal Observation and other activities at Black Lives Matter Memorial Plaza. I began collecting evidence of what I have been calling in an archive White-Violence Safeguarded <> Black Bodies Abducted. As I was doing Legal Observation and becoming more aware of this pattern that I kept seeing from the Summer of 2020, I started getting better at capturing that moment that is so difficult to prove, which is showing the difference in the way the police view what could be threatening white people or MAGA marchers versus how they were viewing those who were on the side of the Movement for Black Lives, protesting and organizing in the aftermath of the lynching of George Floyd and others.

The one piece of video I feel comfortable talking about in this forum from the archive is footage from August 28, 2020 at 12:12 am. The context of this footage is that moments before this video, a white man in Blackface descended onto Black Lives Matter Plaza; he came up to me, Tara Vassefi, the one filming this video, and shoved his phone-camera inches from my face and asked "Why do you think Hillary's a lesbian."

There were many people at Black Lives Matter Plaza during that time - many of whom saw the space as a place to meet, connect, empathize, and process the violence they experienced there earlier that summer in the days immediately following the Lynching of George Floyd. It was a particularly unique traumatizing <> healing space for those who had been tear-gassed and assaulted by MPD during those assemblies exercising our First Amendment rights. When the people at Black Lives Matter Plaza saw this white man in Blackface, it was experienced as an assault especially since many of the people there that night and other times of the day and night were Black Citizens communing peacefully and in solidarity in a safe space to dream designs of how to tuck their bodies into the wheels of injustice to stop them from turning while *simultaneously* Building Their Home InTheir Image. Myself and others attempted to peacefully escort him away from the Plaza and as things escalated because he refused to leave, a line of dozens of MPD on bikes emerged as though out of nowhere, they formed a wall to protect the white man in Blackface and they abducted several Black men in the process - only Black men were abducted. It was so traumatizing that they wouldn't put the white man in Blackface into the police vehicles that were there to remove him from the space. Dozens of MPD officers formed a line with their bodies and their bikes to make sure that the white man in Blackface was kept safe and comfortable in the aftermath of committing this hate crime. When it was deemed safe enough to remove the young white man in Blackface, they gently put him into a MPD vehicle (no arrest or handcuffs) and they drove him to safety.

This video footage depicts the aftermath when MPD officers continued to stand in formation and a witness to this White-Violence Safeguarded <> Black Bodies Abducted recounts what he witnessed to the remaining MPD officers.

I continued to do Legal Observation and other activities at Black Lives Matter Plaza where we would continue to witness over and over again how this violent society and its enforcement mechanism in the form of police state-sponsored violence could not and would not See White-Violence. Visitors to our Home would come to wreak havoc on what they saw as a hotbed of "terrorist organizations" like BLM and Antifa. They were particularly invited by the art and creative expression that blossomed in front of the White House, especially after June 1, 2020 when president trump's administration tear-gassed protestors to make way for his procession to St. John's Episcopal church, sending some kind of signal to his followers by holding a Bible upside-down in front of a place of worship that has since deplored this act of state-sponsored violence.

The number and tempo of these visitors only grew exponentially after Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg transitioned. Shortly after, two Heroines - Nadine and Karen, became the stewards of what is now referred to as the Black Lives Matter Memorial

Fence - an open guerilla gallery space dedicated to Black Power, Joy, Resilience, and Vision for Collective Liberation.

I had the honor and privilege of being in a close collective of comrades committed to supporting Nadine and Karen as they lived and guarded the **Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence** https://www.facebook.com/GuardiansOfTheFence/. We all worked together in solidarity to meet the basic needs of Nadine, Karen, the stewards of the **William Thomas Anti-Nuclear Peace Vigil**

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/White House Peace Vigil, and the unhoused neighbors who considered the Plaza and its immediate area their residence due to extreme housing injustice in this country's capital.

Proud Boys and MAGA marchers would visit every weekend and here and there throughout the week. Many of them would dress in combat gear with black paint under their eyes. Their public chats and discussions would rally around wild claims that "BLM was bussing in people by the 100s." Mind you, at this time Black Lives Matter DC consisted of eight people <> core organizers who had the good sense to know that these ignorant white supremacists, however misguided, are not the enemy: after Learning and Testing how #WeKeepUsSafe during the two Million MAGA Marches on November 14 and December 12, they *encouraged*

I was at Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence the night of January 5 when the Proud Boys and MAGA were able to get a feel for the Power of breaking through the police officer (human) barricade. It's unclear what they were trying to get to since the only things that were on the other side of the police officer barricade were Nadine, Karen, a handful of other guardians of the Black Lives Matter Memorial Fence, the

Fence itself and the White House. And that night marked the very first time that I overheard the officers - who had been tear-gassing, brutalizing, arresting, and abducting protesters for months - express any sense of awareness of the threat posed by the Proud Boys and MAGA. I heard them talking to each other about how shocked they were that these people had the gall to break through a police barricade and when one of them saw that I was eavesdropping, he said to me, "you guys were right."

Just after the 6pm Emergency Curfew on January 6, 2021, I sent the following dispatch (https://www.facebook.com/tara.vassefi/posts/10101770874869732) to my friends and family who were furiously checking in and trying to make sense of what seemed very shocking to them. #WeKeepUsSafe

The police and the system that gives them the power to enforce the laws of this society do what they were *perfectly designed*, **from their inception onward**, to do:

White-Violence Safeguarded <> Black Bodies Abducted

As a first-generation immigrant who was born in a conflict zone, I'm always conflicted when I join hearings like this because while they seem like a wonderful example of participatory democracy, it is *so* disheartening to hear the testimony of brilliant citizens who are doing so much extra unvalued labor to fill the gaps of our failed leadership, our failed public safety policies, our failed public health policies. The lack of proper accountability for these systemic failures is reminiscent of the conditions that lead to large-scale conflict and violence.

The insurrectionists that attempted to take over the Capitol on January 6, 2021 showed us what kind of violence lies in wait. And if you think that there was accountability for that incident, I would urge you to visit and observe MAGA Trump supporters the next time they descend upon our Home en masse like they did most recently on January 23, 2022 to protest vaccine mandates. If you go and observe their behavior, you can see how the police do exactly what they did last year, which is shut down the roads, let them party freely without masks, and continue to dispute the last democratic general election.

It is clear from the wide-ranging testimonies today and from living here that the people here do not trust our elected and unelected officials to do what they say they want to do - keep us all safe, keep us all healthy. You cannot enforce trust and the more you keep empowering law enforcement and ignoring the Community's pleas, the more you will erode social trust. In Our Community, we have everything we need to learn how to trust each other and Build The World We Want. The Trust we need right now cannot be enforced by a corrupted police force that was historically created to protect white property and abduct/snatch Black people who were forced into slavery. That is the history of this country's police force. That is what we continue fortifying when we keep putting aside budget money for this police force. So I would encourage you to implement something like a hostile corporate takeover of the policing system here and hire/pay these people who testified today to build an actual legal and justice system that is going to keep us safe. Thank you very much.

Chocolate City, aka Occupied Piscataway Territory, aka washington dc has a long, rich history of Mutual Aid particularly within the Black Church and amongst the historically-segregated neighborhoods East of the [Anacostia] River ("EOR"). To learn more about this history, I would recommend what I believe should be required reading for all District residents and visitors: *Black Food Geographies: Race, Self-Reliance, and Food Access in Washington, DC*

Dr. Reese spent nearly a decade doing ethnographic and empirical research on ~Chocolate Cities and Towns across this country, focusing on this fascinating nexus of race, self-reliance and food access, and she Chose to focus her dissertation on our beloved Home because of the unique lessons and dynamics she observed here.


"Black Food Geographies toggles between macro-level analyses of food apartheid and micro-level analyses of how residents navigate the unequal food landscape... The historical and ongoing significance of race at the intersections of capitalist accumulation, dispossession, and residential segregation requires an understanding of how the geographic distribution of food is a reflection of anti-Blackness and oppression as much as it is about class and economic capital... The increasingly corporatized food system is not simply unequal, it is a by-product of how structural racism touches every aspect of life -- even where our food resources are located." (emphasis added)

This 2020 iteration of Mutual Aid in our City was catalyzed out of East of the River ("EOR") by longtime Black Lives Matter and adjacent activists and it sparked the Spirit of so many people that within a matter of days, neighbors had set up a network of grocery-deliveries to high-risk neighbors that was so speedy, effective, and efficient that the DC Government and Mayor's Covid response initiatives attempted to pass it off as



The Great And Terrible Swarm

After the transition of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg, the species Swarmed.

A Queen Bee emerged in the form of Nadine Seiler - nee Otego (born May 11, 1965), also known as Warrior Goddess for the Resistance, a political and BLM activist, t-shirt designer, home organizer service provider from Waldorf, Maryland.

On October 27, 2020, Seiler, along with Karen Irwin - a volunteer with the William Thomas Anti-Nuclear Peace Vigil - became the "guardians of the fence." The day before, Amy Coney Barrett was confirmed to refill Ruth Bader Ginsberg's seat as a Supreme Court Justice. That night, a small group of self-identified "conservative and anti-abortion activists" who said "they came to celebrate Barrett's ascension to the bench...pulled away sign after sign. Seiler and the strangers around her tried to block the signs with their bodies." Though there were regular incidents of passive vandalism over the months that the BLM Fence evolved, this incident stood out for how destructive it was: by the time the vandals left "the wall was nearly empty."

Following this incident, Seiler, became the pacesetter of a group of community members who collectively formed an unorganized and unspoken alliance to protect the BLM Fence from future desecration. This collective included unhoused and unsheltered folk who lived in and around the area as well as volunteers from the William Thomas Anti-Nuclear Peace Vigil like Irwin. The guardians of the fence succeeded in maintaining a near-constant vigil at the BLM Fence and on the larger block of Black

Black Food Geographies: Race, Self-Reliance, and Food Access in Washington, DC by Dr. Ashanté M. Reese

Indigenous, and other People of Color who were geographically, socially, and systemically kept away from capital and other centralized resources. Chocolate City, aka unseated Piscataway Territory, aka "Washington, DC" has a particularly rich history of Mutual Aid, both through the Black Church and also due to the astounding resilience of those who live(d) in the formerly-segregated neighborhoods East of the River. My favorite piece of learning on this topic comes from a book that I believe every visitor and resident of DC should read, understand, re-read: Black Food Geographies: Race, Self-Reliance and Food Access in Washington, DC where Dr. Ashante M. Reese transferred a decade's worth of knowledge-bearing and expertise at this nexus in various "Chocolate Cities" around the country and chose DC because of its particularly unique lessons in Abundance. Dr. Reese archived oral histories of our beloved older siblings in Ward 7 and especially the Deanwood neighborhood to support the following revelation:

"Because of the presumed nothingness" that is embedded in understandings of so-called food deserts, food justice advocates outside of these neighborhood spaces often overlook or do not see the ways in which residents make 'ways out of no way' that are embedded in their own food security and reflect their hopes and desires for their communities more broadly.

Arguably, Black communities' investment in self-reliance as a political and cultural framework for communal uplift has been central to intellectual thought and activist strategizing. Transitions from mass enslavement, migration from the South to the North and West, and integration (albeit limited) into new consumer spheres from which they were once barred prompted questions about how best to meet Black people's needs in a nation in which the rights of full citizenship had yet to be granted. These questions were as fundamentally about space and place as they were about accessing goods. Black residents, many of them living in segregated neighborhoods in urban centers, navigated white supremacy daily, using their segregated neighborhoods as places to build as much institutional capacity to meet their daily needs as possible."







Thank you water for the passage of time Your person vanished But your soul is forever sealed to mine



Long answer... Mathematically, there's a thing you can do to 2 equal sized sets of numbers called a Dot Product. Whenever a Dot Product of 2 things is 0, then they are considered Orthogonal to each other. In the case of Euclidean Geometry and Cartesian Coordinates, which is how most people think of math (the x and y axis graph approach to describing things we all learned in school), when you take 2 Perpendicular lines, if the 2 lines are described as Vectors (like an arrow that has Direction and Length), the Dot Product is 0 and they are Orthogonal. Orthogonal things sometimes have significance or impact on the real world, when applied to physics. Like, you are most stable when you build a building straight up to a flat ground - the building and ground are Orthogonal.

We are all very intuitively familiar with this implementation of a dot product/orthogonality and even gave it its own name - perpendicularity. It's just that the dot product can apply to many more approaches/concepts in math because it really just boils down to needing 2 Sets Of Numbers, and so a 0 Dot Product exists in other concepts than just 2 Perpendicular Lines. Imagine, for example, the history of temperatures in DC and San Diego. You could find the Dot Product of that data and find that they are orthogonal. In each of those areas, it May (or May Not) have some Significance the way right angles do in normal geometry or physics (in the case of the temperatures, probably no significance).

The subtitle of "Evolving Orthogonally" suggests moving in a direction that isn't on the existing line (spectrum) of thought. Like, if either patriarchy is a spectrum itself in some way, or if there's a spectrum from patriarchy to its opposite, we want to very specifically go (evolve) in a 3rd direction that is equally distant from the other 2 ends of the spectrum."
