Scripture is the path upon which we tread when our fellowship began to fully embrace the good news that each person is created in God's image- inclusive of all cultures, races, genders, and orientations. Our identity as Biblical, Relational, Intergenerational, Doing Justice, Giving Freely, and Embracing Diversity encourages us to seek the truth revealed in Jesus- throughout the witness of scripture- that leads to life, for individuals and for our community.

The metaphor the Lord has given us for our journey to full inclusion of our LGBTQ+ family is of crossing water on the dry ground of scripture to the Promised Land. We have followed this path-opened through prayer, and made firm by the wind of the Holy Spirit- through monthly 3-hour Saturday Bible Studies. Join us with these notes and recordings.

The instructions in Leviticus describe a particular moral ethic for ancient Israelites to be separate from surrounding peoples. Lay teacher Kevin Hamilton looks at the issues of purity and how these affect Israel's relationship to the land of Promise. <u>Notes</u>. <u>Recording</u>

Jesus' interpretations of Sabbath and Kashrut law is the template for understanding the Law.
