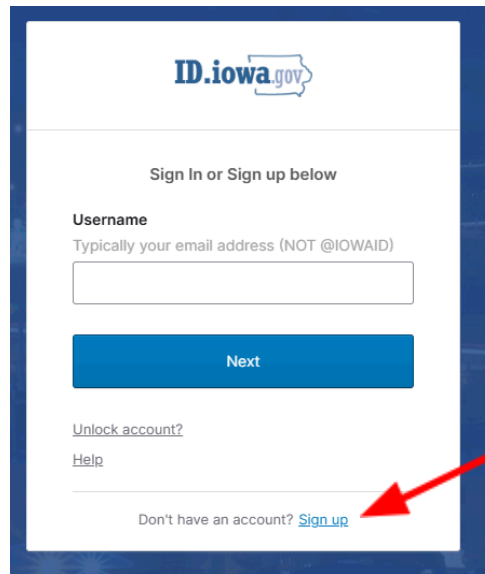


# Registering for an Okta Account to Access IowaCNP

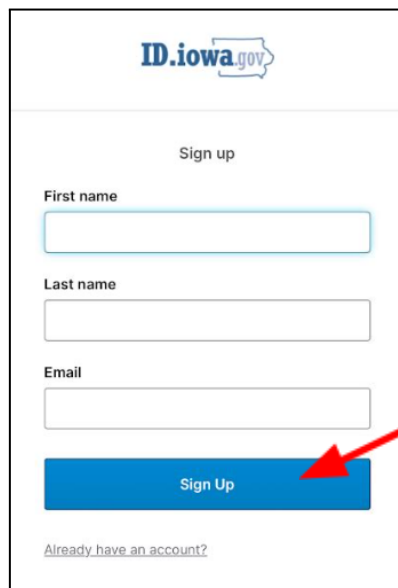
An Okta ID.iowa.gov account in order to access IowaCNP. Okta is the single sign-on authentication method for the state of Iowa.

1. Visit [id.iowa.gov](https://id.iowa.gov).
2. Click on “Sign up” in the bottom center of the white box.

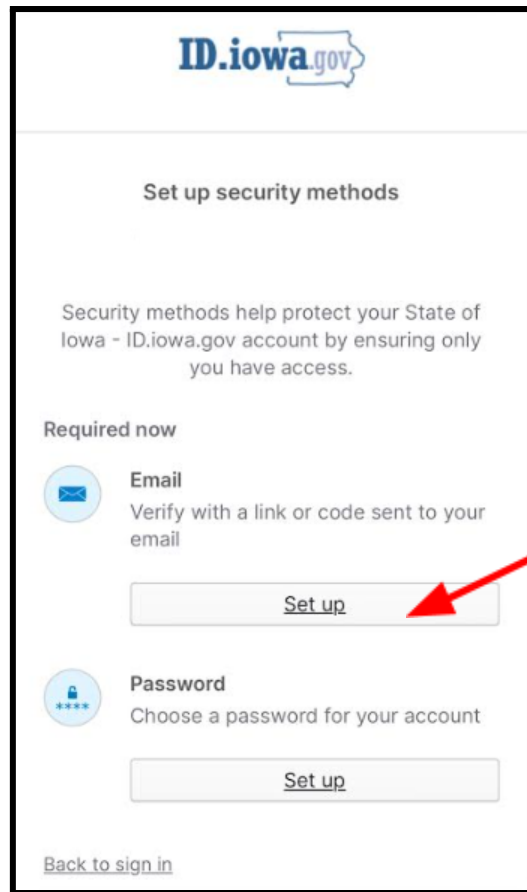


3. Type in your First name, Last Name, and Email, then click the blue, “Sign Up” button. **The email must match the email used in the Security section of IowaCNP.**

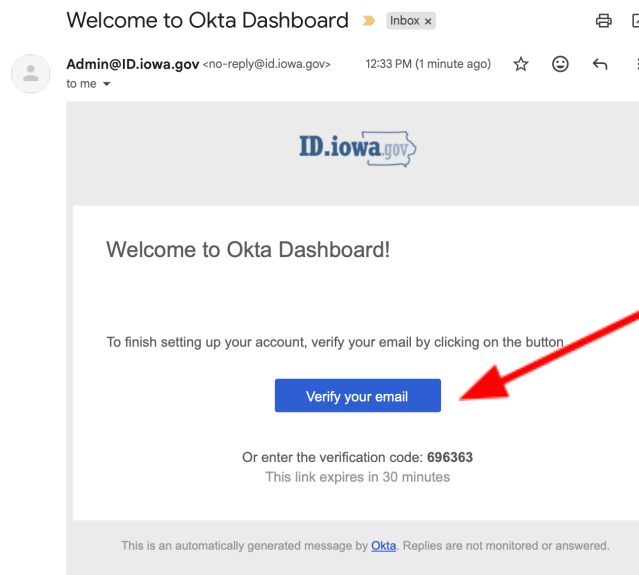
If the system generates the following message: “A user with this email already exists,” go back and select the “Already have an account?” option and reset password.



4. Set up security methods. Click on “Set up” under the Email section.



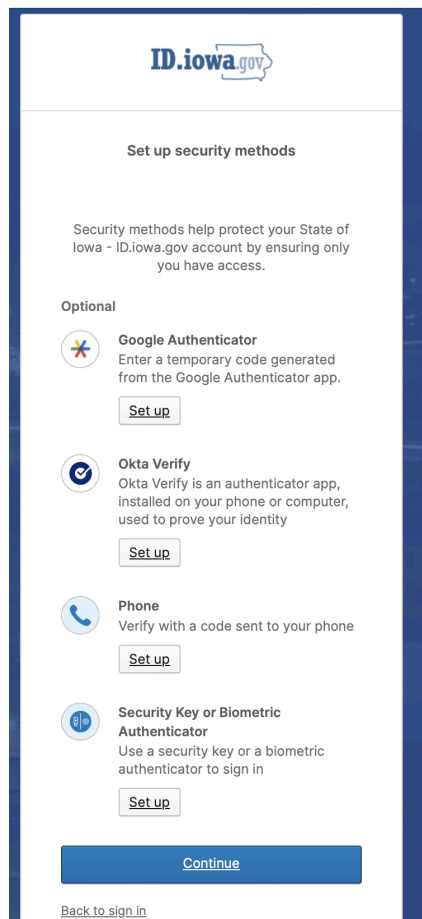
5. An email should have been received from [Admin@ID.iowa.gov](mailto:Admin@ID.iowa.gov). Open the email and click on the blue “Verify your email” button.



6. Set up a password. Click on “Set up” and then enter a password, using the following requirements:
- At last 12 characters
  - No parts of username
  - Does not include first name
  - Does not include last name
  - Cannot be the same as last 30 passwords



7. Set up multi-factor security methods by choosing **one** of the following options. Once set up on a device, a code will be needed to sign in to the system, before being allowed to sign in. The security method selected will be required each time you access IowaCNP. Note: It is not recommended to use biometric authenticator as it prevents users from logging in from other computers.



**If the creation process is not completed (timed out) or an error message is received, please wait 24 hours for the process to reset and then try creating an account from the start.**

## Federal Civil Rights Statement
