Subject: Concern Over Noem v. Vasquez Perdomo

To the Justices of the Supreme Court:

I am writing as a deeply concerned citizen about the Court’s September 8 emergency order in Noem v. Vasquez Perdomo. Allowing immigration enforcement officers to treat ethnicity, language, job type, and location as factors for suspicion erodes the protections guaranteed under the Fourth Amendment.

The Constitution promises that people in the United States will be secure against unreasonable searches and seizures. This ruling undermines that promise, placing millions of people, citizens and non-citizens alike, at risk of profiling and discriminatory enforcement.

I respectfully urge the Court to reconsider the broad consequences of this decision as the case proceeds. History will remember whether the Court stood on the side of equal protection and constitutional rights.
