



Lloyd E. Hanneman, age 73, of Oshkosh, passed away on Friday, April 12, 1996 at home with his family. He was born August 8, 1922 in Oshkosh, a son of Conrad and Justine (Ruhl) Hanneman. Evelyn F. Lautenschlager and he were joined in marriage on May 6,
