Students who are interested in a career in education can explore various career opportunities and learn about infant, child and adolescent development in the concentrator course. In the capstone course students will develop their skills and knowledge in the area of pedagogy (teaching) by tutoring on campus or shadowing and interning off campus at local feeder schools.</p>
