## A Biblical Theology of the Sexes

### Course Description

Within the Scriptures there are extensive underexplored resources for a Christian understanding of the sexes: narratives, poetry, wisdom, prophecy, symbol, and letters. This course is an investigation of the scope of the scriptural witness on these matters, demonstrating the diverse ways that it can inform our thought and practice. Escaping the narrow orbit of a few didactic texts, the prominence and importance of the symbolism of male and female throughout the canon will be examined. The course will consider how these broader scriptural witnesses can be integrated into a richer account of the sexes and how such an account might change the complexion of pressing questions in our contemporary cultural and ecclesial contexts. In addition to strengthening students' grasp of the substantive teaching of the scriptures on the issue of the sexes, this course will equip students to be more adept in their use of the breadth of the scriptures as a theological source.

#### Course Format

The format of the course will blend short lectures and guided discussion of the assigned texts. Students will be expected to come having read and engaged with the text selections for the week, and with thoughts prepared to contribute. On a typical week, students will be expected to read between 50 and 100 pages for the class, which will include selected passages of Scripture and secondary literature.

Classes will meet on Zoom for two hours weekly and will be recorded for absent students (not for dissemination outside of class). Additional student participation and instructor interaction will take place on our Discord channel, which students will be given access to before the course. Google Classroom will be used for assignment submissions, grades, and announcements.

#### Course Objectives:

Objectives for this course include: (1) to explore a variety of biblical portrayals of male and female; (2) to increase knowledge of the breadth of the biblical text's teaching on the sexes; (3) to improve capacity to handle diverse texts as scripture.

## Course Requirements for degree-seeking students:

Class Participation (20%): Attentive and sustained participation in class is the primary requirement. For-credit students may have two excused absences.


Oral examination (30%): At the conclusion of the course, I will schedule a 15-30-minute Zoom session to assess you on your mastery of the relevant concepts and material from the course. Writing (50%): Students will submit a weekly written piece, of at least 500 words in length, with a brief synopsis and critical reflection on one of the readings set for the week.

### Course Requirements for other for-credit students:

Class Participation (20%): Attentive and sustained participation in class is the primary requirement. For-credit students may have two excused absences.

Writing (80%): A 4,000 word term paper, involving significant engagement with course readings as well as substantive research in outside sources, due two weeks after the conclusion of the term.
